Col. Epperson, a strong advocate of the bill, in this precarious condition of things had moved a reconsideration both of the call for the previous question, and of the motion for the final passage of the bill. Col. Epperson, in his speech on his motion, had suggested and invited compromise between the friends and opponents of the bill. This is the ground of the mention of a substitute in the telegrame received here; it is boped one can be framed which will not be substantially different from the present bill, but more acceptable to many members. 
