ALABAMA INTIMIDATION.

These depredations and acts of violence that you speak of having been committed, were committed upon colored Republicans. A. T. B. says, they treated all the colored people as Republicans.

Q. Do you know of any acts of violence or depredations of that kind being committed of colored or white Democrats? A. No, sir; I never heard of any. If I could see just as much of the Democratic party as they would see of me, I would be glad to see them. I have been to me and offered me \$5,000 to join the Democratic party.

Q. What was the name of the man who offered you \$5,000 to join the Democratic party? A. It was John C. Smith. He said, 'You shall suffer.'

In another connection on page 23, the same witness testified further to the killing of Billings and other outrages. By Mr. Buckner: Q. When was that? A. That was just before this election.

ALFRED WRIGHT AND DICK WRIGHT saw them kill Mr. Billings. They saw Dick Wright twenty dollars, and told him never to say anything about it. It was some time before Dick said, say anything about it. They told him Nelson Dole to leave or they were going to kill him. The night he was killed, after they turned him loose, they beat him so bad that he did not come to his right senses for two or three days. I went to see him, and pulled off his shirt, and took my finger and squashed the blood out of his back the same as if it was rotten pumpkin, and pulled splinters fully an inch long out of his back. I saw his lips up to his shoulders. It was a long time before I could get him to tell who did it.

By Mr. Johnson: Q. How many colored members of the Legislature have been elected since the war from that county? A. Eight. They

KILLED EDWARD RICHARD BURNETT at his home on the 13th of 1870. Q. When was he killed? A. The latter part of 1869, I think, or the first of 1870. Q. What has become of the others? A. They all got away from them and ran off. They did not kill them; they killed him very bad. I saw a man named Montgomery. Q. What are the others? A. There are several other men named Billy Taylor, he is there. Milton Dole is there, James Hill and Granville Bennett.

Q. Were these men who speak of the men being killed and others, real officers, or how? A. They were killed on account of their politics. Q. By whom? By the Ku Klux, they said they were disguised men. Q. When was the last man shot? A. I think George was shot in 1868. Q. By whom? A. I don't know. If these colored people were let alone in that section of the country would they prosper and have comfortable and secure homes? A. They would. Q. And make good citizens? Yes, sir, no man can go back upon their record there, but the Government will not give them some protection. They are bound to emigrate and go to some other country. By Mr. Buckner: Q. A good many are going off to Mississippi all through the State? A. A good many will go. They have not left our county, but I am determined that there are a good many coming out from Mississippi trying to get down to our county. I have seen many people from my county told me they would not leave until I got home, to see if they would be protected by the strong arm of the Government sent to our county.
