Grand Celebration in Nashville, Nashville, Tenn., Feb. 23.—In the annual of Nashville no such celebration has been known as that which took place today in commemorating the birthday of Washington. Almost the entire population turned out, those not in the procession taking themselves on the sidewalk to wave national flags and lend enthusiasm to the great pageant. There must have been 20,000 people out of doors.

Perhaps the principal significance of the occasion was the fact that Federals, ex-Federals, and Confederates and colored population vied with each other in giving full play to sentiment which ignores past differences and fully recognizes united nationality. The Chief Marshal of the day was Gen. Pennypacker, Federal-commander of the post, and his two dozen or so of aids were mostly made up of ex-Federal and ex-Confederate officers. There was also a couple of companies of U. S. soldiers headed by a post band. General Pennypacker, as he rode along the line, was cheered lustily, while the women waved diminutive flags, and thousands of children yelled their joy at the top of their voices. The pageant was an extraordinary success, not only in the way of celebrating Washington's birthday, but still more so blending the blue and the gray, and showing the universal sentiment of patriotism existing. Business was entirely suspended during the afternoon.

Foreign News.

Deaths of French Politicians. PARIS, Feb. 23.—Jean Baptiste Camille Corot the French painter, is dead.

ATTITUDE OF THE PRESS AND MINISTRY ON M. WALLON'S AMENDMENT. The organs of Bonapartists are indignant at the passage by the Assembly yesterday of M. Wallon's amendment to the Senate bill.

The Republican papers, with the exception of La Francisc, are jubilant over the passage of the amendment. La Francisc thinks only half the work is necessary to be done has been accomplished.

The Ministers, with the exception of M. Tailhand, Minister of Interior, supported the amendment of M. Wallon. M. Tailhand voted no, and Baron Chabaud abstained from voting.

MANAGE OF THE SENATE BILL—ITS PROVISIONS. In the Assembly to-day the Senate bill was considered in detail and passed, clause by clause.

The following are its main features: It appropriates the number of Senators to each department. The Seine and Nord have five each, and the others four, three, or two, according to population. The Senators are to be elected by colleges, composed of Deputies of the Assembly, Councils of the Arrondissements, and delegates from the municipalities. Electors representing arrondissements and colleges are to be elected every three years. Those elected by the Assembly are ineligible. Vacancies by death, resignation, or other cause before the expiration of the term, to be filled by the Senate itself.

The Senate equally with the Chamber of Deputies, is authorized to initiate laws financial bills; however, must first pass the Deputies. The Senate may become a high court of justice to try the President of the Republic or his ministers, or any persons accused of conspiring against the State. The first Senate shall be elected a month before the dissolution of the Assembly separates.

House 6, relating to the appointment of only five Senators by the Assembly, was not passed.

M. Dalpit, a Conservative Liberal, moved an amendment, providing that these senators be selected from a double list of names presented by the President of the Republic. The clause, with the proposed amendments was referred to the Committee of Thirty for reconsideration.

The third reading of the bill organizing the Senate was fixed for to-morrow.

Resolution that the Senate bill do not take effect until the passage of the public powers bill, was adopted. M. Hoel Dalpit, who conducted the debate on behalf of the Bonapartists, continued throughout the proceedings to move exceedingly. He read appendices, with the hope of detaching the Left from the two Centers and defeating the bill, but the coalition stood firm, and all efforts were rejected by overwhelming majorities.

The Bonapartists supported members of the Left of attacking their principles and attacking the national sovereignty. As a final desperate effort to defeat the bill, they moved an amendment, providing that it can not become a law until ratified by universal suffrage. They declared if the bill was thus ratified they would submit. It was the duty of the Left, they said, to vote for this amendment, if they really wished to control the affairs of the State. 4,000,000 of voters could not without their consent be placed in the hands of a body elected as this bill contemplated. The amendment was lost, carrying only the vote of the Bonapartist deputies.

COGNAC, CHAMPAGNE, & C.

New York, Feb. 24.—President Octon, of the Western Union Company, has received a telegram from the London manager of the Anglo-American Cable Company, saying that from May last the tariff on messages from New York to the United Kingdom and France will be fifty cents gold per word, and that the company's system of charging messages will be extended to other countries in Europe and elsewhere.

JUDICIAL—PERSONAL—NEWS.

SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH, Feb. 24.—This morning G. C. Bates, a lawyer of the firm of Richardson & Bates, published a card saying he has been served with an order from the Second District Court, Judge Boreman, leaving Utah to appear before him the first Monday in April, and show cause why he should not be punished for contempt and arrested. The attorney stated that the order was issued against him by the Hon. Judge Boreman, for failure to appear at the hearing on the case which had been adjourned to proceed on order from the

of the parties having fled beyond the jurisdiction of the court, and offering to appear for trial if no arrests would be made.

MINOR TELEGRAMS.

Gen. James R. Hawley has been re-nominated for Congress by the Republicans of the first District of Connecticut. The woman's suffrage question came up in the Massachusetts House yesterday on a resolution to amend the Constitution as to give the right of suffrage to women. The resolution was defeated—yeas 25, nays 190.

The Minnesota House Committee on Railroads last night reported unanimously in favor of the Morse bill, which repeals the railroad legislation of last winter, and provides that one commission, with advisory duties.

The State Prohibition Convention assembled this morning at the City Hall, Columbus, O., 100 persons being present. The morning was completed with the business. In the afternoon a State ticket was nominated.
