Washington, March 5 .- Tobucco and cigar stamps in the hauds of manufacturers onnot be affixed to packages, but may be exchanged by Collectors of Internal Revenue for stamps issued under the pay act. The new far or tobacco, sigars and sigarettes took effect at Midnight of March 3 technically, but the Commissioner in his instructions has allowed the point of demarcation to begin en the morning of March 3, which makes the differences between midnight and ordinary business goors, when deputies, who sleep late, go around to impaire.
