### Growth of the West.

Of the extent to which sectional strength in Congress has been changed within the last twenty years, the following returns of the Senate from New England and the Middle States comprised more than one third of the whole number; in 1874 they rised less than one-fourth. In 1854 the House was made up of 76 members from the South, 59 from the West, and 99 from the Middle States and New England; total, 214. In 1874 the House was made up of 86 from the South, 104 from the West, and 102 from the Middle States and New England ; to:al, 292. The Western States have nearly doubled their membership; the New England States have lost one member, and the Middle States have gained four; the South (counting West Virginia as a Southern State) has gained ten members. If Colorado and New Mexico should be admitted as States, the relative strength of the West, especially in the Senate, will be still further increased. The ruling power of the country is thus passing away from the "old thirteen," and their near neighbors, and is being absorbed by the more rapidly growing popplation of the West. But this change involves no more danger of sectional legislation than existed when New England and the Middle States held the ruling power. It may be expected, however, to somewhat influence the general drift of legislation.-Philadelphia Ledger.






