"The death of an Almond."

We have been furnished by a talented young gentleman in our city an account of a very strange incident that happened years ago in Virginia, which never has been related before.

Two associations proposed.

It will require all the lashings of the patriotic press to rouse the people of Texas up to anything like "united" action in the approaching election for a Constitutional convention. Some of the more intelligent democratic papers take a different party nomination or a free fight; these papers will lead the way when once the "unter-

"Terrorized." The prospect is surely not a cheerful one to the ace-loving citizen; a revolution, so great as that involving a change in our organic law, is enough to cause every good citizen serious forebodings, especially when partisan spirit rules the hour, and an overwhelming majority, in full possession of all the patronage and machinery of government, proposes to frame a Constitution peculiarly suited to their notions and with the intention of trampling under foot the minority.

The Republicans of Texas number at least 60,000 if a full vote could be obtained; and to each and every Republican the proposal to overturn our present Constitution is one of great moment, and they should stand as one man against it. With the solid Republican strength as a basis of opposition, the proposition can be defeated.

There are some who feel careless of the result of a Constitutional Convention regarding it as a matter entirely for the Democracy to settle, and hoping that out of confusion something better than the present state of things will come. It is in this manner men have in times gone by, lost their liberties. We are in favor of a vigorous and determined opposition to the threatened revolution, we know it is the result of ambition, of bitter party strife, and we believe it will be condemned by the majority of the people.

Gatesville, Jan. 16th.— Last Saturday evening, James and Johnson, came to town, and while here both became slightly under the influence of liquor. While going home in the evening they got into a dispute, in which Johnson called Johnson a liar. Johnson instantly seized his Spencer rifle, which hung to the horn of his saddle, and shot Johnson the bullet entering through the top of the big bone, passing nearly through the body and lodging in the other side. Johnson rode on a few steps and fell from his horse. John son was shot at close range, and died and was plowed over his victim. He then turned over, when Johnson gave him his horse as being the best he had, and told him to go to Fredericksburg. The two men then rode out. Other an affectionate farewell, and Johnson left. Johnson was carried home, where he lay for some time, and then died. The two men were buried in a body without distinction, although at this writing none knew who was buried in the grave. The two men were buried in the same hole, and when the body was taken out, the man with a broken leg had a strong injury with bullet, this would not have occurred.

The New Decade.

Our nation is just entering upon a new decade. On the 4th of April, 1865, the national forces occupied Richmond, on the 9th Lee and on the 17th Johnson surrendered. The death of President Lincoln occurred on the 15th. With the middle of April, therefore, the war may be said to have ended. There were assassination conspirators to be tried, rebel fortifications to be dismantled, and forces to be dislodged, the resources of the Confederacy to be confiscated, and the whole of the men and women and children deserted and left their camps. The men occupied a commanding and hill across the river. Captain Kettler's company of cavalry followed them, and they opened fire on him with a number of rifles which had concealed in the sand hills.

He immediately attacked them. I arrived on the ground and fought them from 8 p.m. until dark with three companies of cavalry, most of the Sixth and part of the Tenth, and a Gatling gun. They held the position until eight. We charged their strongly entrenched position three times, once mounted, had to dismount and charge on foot, where I had a great many men wounded. I discovered at day break this morning, upon opening fire, that during the night the Indians had left, and their trail went west of the North fork.

I have ordered two companies of cavalry to attack these Indians as soon as they feed their horses and men. We have three dead Indians and suppose more to have been wounded and killed. I had sixteen men wounded, four severely, and four horses killed and several wounded.

I have thirty-two hostile Cheyenne prisoners safe in the guardhouse and ironed, including Grey Beard, Minimac, Head of Birds, Medicine Water. Yesterday at 8 a.m. I sent a letter to Capt. Meek, en route to this place, and asked assistance from Fort Sill. The friendly Cheyennes and Arapahoes took no part in the fight. I am afraid the hostiles, who have gone West, will make a junction with the thirty-seven who are on the Canadian near Antelope Hill, and have sent copy of this telegram to Dodge and Supply and Major Bidle.
