At the Schurz banquet in Berlin the chairman Mr. Thompson in proposing a toast to the United States and Germany, said:

"The United States and Germany; with the old Teutonic free that glows in both nations, and a kindred inspiration for freedom, culture and faith, may they lead on in both hemispheres the eye of knowledge, liberty and peace!"

Dr. Friedrich Kapp rose to respond to this toast, and begged leave to speak in German, inasmuch as several Germans present could not understand English. "Certainly," said the Chairman, "we Americans are capable of understanding two languages." Dr. Kapp said:

"Out of the rich stock of common ideas and aims he wished to pick out one which gave the key for the understanding of the position and development of both nations. This momentum or essential element was their common feeling of personal responsibility, of serious work, the common feeling of duty or, in other words, the Autonomy of the Individual, which consciously and unconsciously forms the starting point and terminus of the moral, social and political life of the Teutonic nations, which has made Germany one of the spiritual leaders in modern civilization, which had been inherited by our transatlantic cousins, and which had given them so proud a position in the history of the new world. While this spirit had shown itself with us in a higher degree on the field of religious liberty of scientific and philosophical research and the culture of art than in daily life, it had become practical in America and had in spite of innumerable obstacles conquered with, indomitable energy a whole continent to civilization. The German declaration of the freedom of conscience from Rome, with which Luther opened the era of the Reformation, found its logical completion in the American Declaration of Independence from England. That great historical act of October 31st 1517, by which freedom of conscience was proclaimed to the world on the doors of the church of Wittenberg, formed only the first link in that chain of gigantic events which was closed on July 4th 1776 in the State House of Philadelphia. In this sense the 4th of July is a great deed of the Teutonic genius, is just as good a German holiday as our Luther will always be a hero to free thinking Americans. And as his works, so the treasures of art and science which have been gained by the generous sacrifices of our scholars and philosophers belong to the whole civilized world. And our present deadly conflict at Rome which we are willing and bound to fight out to the last is a war which we carry on in the interest of your country as well as my American friends, as for the benefit of all mankind."

The democratic ticket.

It will almost generally be admitted that the democratic Convention of this District was as much stocked as any Convention of political wire-pullers ever has been. As far as the delegates from Bexar County are concerned they certainly do not claim to have represented their party, in as much as they can not boast of more than about a baker's dozen of constituents. It is a notable fact that in the Ward meetings of this city there were not enough democrats in attendance to make up the requisite number of delegates out of those present. We are not informed that any of the outside precincts did take the trouble to call a meeting. From Comal County we know that Mr. Pfeuffer, a most intimate friend of John Ireland, in order to secure a delegation to Fredericksburg, had to rope in every good democrat to make up a meeting, and then he only succeeded in obtaining a majority of seven in favor of electing delegates.

The meeting in Gillespie County was worked up by that insignificant democratic carpet-bagger Callan, once a Republican, then a Liberal, and now a devoted Coke man. Three fourths of the voters of Gillespie County, and perhaps more, did not take any stock in this movement.

Kerr County has declared against a Constitutional Convention. The few democrats of Kendall County had it all to themselves.

We do not know the particulars of the democratic meeting in the other counties, but are satisfied they have been of the same character as those cited above.

Takes all in all the Fredericksburg convention did not represent more than one tenth of the members of its party, and yet this one tenth undertakes to dictate to the whole people of the District whom they shall elect to frame the highest organic law of the State.

And who are they that, by Coke's and Ireland's order, they are told to honor?

Here is Mr. Jacob Waelder, a citizen of San Antonio, and a good lawyer, unquestionably. But what are his qualifications for the position he seeks. What are his ideas about immigration, about Free schools? We are informed that Mr. Waelder has expressed himself against Free schools and in favor of supporting sectarian schools. We tell Mr. Waelder that the time has passed when the people could be scared with the mere name of a Free school! The necessity of having good and independent non-sectarian schools is now felt all over the country, and now while the people in the Western and Northern States, have en-masse risen in defense of this truly republican institution—that has been assailed by the worst enemies of the Republic, we are satisfied the South will not stand back and permit the sacred school fund to be distributed amongst those who preach bigotry, fanaticism and religious war. Let Mr. Waelder rise and explain what he thinks of Free schools, and we will tell him what we think of him.

Next we have Mr. King from Boerne, a good citizen, we believe, but as a law-maker as imbecil as a goat would be for the place of a gardener. We have tried him in the Senate and house of representatives, and have nothing to record of his career as a legislator, his energy appearing to have been concentrated in delivering spread eagle speeches.

Third and last Mr. A. O. Cooley is offered us as a candidate. Mr. Cooley was a member of the first Reconstruction Convention and elected on the Republican ticket. He remained a Republican until the election of 1868 when he became a Hamiltonian and, like so many others, after having passed through the purgatory of Liberal Republicanism, landed safely in the harbor of the democratic party.

Although we oppose the election of mere party men for the Constitutional Convention, yet we like to see men of character before the people, men whose political principles are well defined and not subject to continual changes by the pressure of the political atmosphere.

These are the candidates of the democratic party.

On the 11th of June there was one of the "most beautiful snow-storms of the season" at Calumet, on Lake Superior. The thermometer fell from ninety degrees in the shade to forty degrees, in less than half an hour. Refreshing!

Thirteen crews are to take part—Yale, Harvard, Columbia, Princeton, Amherst, Williams, Dartmouth, Cornell, Brown, Hamilton, Wesleyan, Bowdoin, and Union. Most of the crews are already on the ground. The Yale, or English, stroke is in great favor this year, and it is fair to expect a keener and more exciting struggle than has ever taken place in this country.

ALFONSO has just escaped a fate like that of the Spanish Republic. He was nearly the victim of a military conspiracy, but the plot was discovered before ripe by the Portuguese Minister, and the conspirators have been divided between the Balearic and Canary Islands.

The number of lives sacrificed in the celebration of the 4th of July seems to be smaller this year than usual. Perhaps less than a score of people have been killed. This is doing very well.
