Texas and Pacific Railway.

The Act under which the Texas The Act under which the Texas and Pacific railway organized, passed Congress in March, 1871, and supplemental Acts have been passed in 1872, 1873 and 1874. The charter authorized the construction of a railway ou the thirty-second parallel from Marshall, Texas, through to the Pacific coast. In March 1872, the company purchased the franchise and property of the Southern Pacific Railroad Company, owning and operating 66 miles of road between Shreveport and Longview, with the right to extend its line to El Paso, on the Rio Grande. Subsequently, was purchased also, the charter privileges and property of the Southern Transcontinental Railroad Company, These companies were organized under the laws of Texas.

of Texas. The total miles of road operated at the end of the year was 323— from Shreveport to Dallas, and beyond westward, and to Texarka-na, northeast of Marshall, towards The Largest Daily Circulation

Little Rock. The equipment consists of 59 locomofives, and 448 cars, of all kinds. The net earnings per mile was \$1,228.94.

The line east of Fort Worth, a few niles west of Dallas, it is ex-pected, will be completed this year. There will still be nearly fitteen hundred miles between Fort Worth and the Pacific Ocean, and this, it is necessary, should be built in the shortest possible time. Hence, government assistance will be sought under such terms as will secure the construction of a good road. No subsidy will be asked. The United States will only be requested to guarantee the interest, not the principal, at the rate of five per principal, at the rate of five per cent. per annum, on construction bonds to be issued by the company. 
