# THE JEWS.

Some courtious, and in some respects arrayising, particulars have lately been collected and published in a French paper, respecting the Jews. Although the Israclites hold such an important place in trade, commerce and finance, and are to be met with in every quarter of the world, it appears that they are to be found in least numbers in some of the most commercial countries, and in most commercial countries, and in most numbers in some of the least prosperous and enterprizing states. Moreover, widely as they are scat tered, and numerous as they appear to be, it seems from the statistics in question that the whole race falls short of five millious of souls. In France, where there exists 'little or none of the stupid and barbarous prejudice against the Jews which prevails in some countries, and where one would think there was a wider field for the pecular talents of the race, there are only 46,000 Jews. In America, apparently a still more favorable country, there are only 120,000 Israelites. on the other hand, in wretched, unprosperous and down-trodden Poland the Jews are to be found in greatest number, one out of every seven of the inhabitants being a Hebrew. One can under-stand that there should be a few Jews in Spain, but is it surprising they should be almost as rare in Belgium. In Sweden there are comparitively few Jews, but they abound in Hamburg, Austria and Roumania in the proportion of one to every twenty four inhabitants. In Hamburg and Austria there is abundant employment for their talents, but in Roumania there cannot be any great scope for their commercial and financial in-stincts.
