No clo e observer of political matters will full to notice how parties receive their edherants. While there are two great political parties figuring in the country o-day, each having many hundreds of housands of followers and supporters, still we think it safe to say that not suehalf of those who call themselves Demo crate, or one half of those who call themselves Republicans, understand the principles of their party. The question then arisms, how come they to be Democrats or Republicans? If they are the blind supporters at the ballot-box of certain politteal principles, what it fluence is it that inclines them to vote as they do f

Within the brief period of our political life, we have found much interest in studying the influence of politics upon the Republican patentage grow up, almost unexceptionably, a Republican. If his father, however, was not a rampant politician, or of decided political prejudices, and the son by chance fellinto a companion ship with young men of Democratic incli nations, he was influenced to call himsely a Democrat and to vote with the old party upon his majority. And these esme resulta oncur with all parties Men dis appointed in their political aspirations, or who are strongly opposed by fellow partisans, are often led to dissent from the party of their first choice for an opposite party alliance. No one knows better than the strict party man the unreliability of the common suffragan, should the doings of his party in conventions and the utter ance of the party leaders not accord with his views. Review the political world, and you find that prejudice, more than principle, creates the common partisan.

We hear it often remarked, and it has even been said by our President, that the fact of the negroes having been freed by a party opposed to the old Southern slave holders, who were generally Domocrats, cossarily renders the colount man a Reublican, and that unless intimidated he will over cast his ballot for the Republi can party, which is set up as the party through the instrumentality of whose adherants the abolition of slavery was secured. Such talk is not supported by the political history of the country, nor is such a supposition the conclusion that will be arrived at by any student of buman nature. Can it be said that the n gross are not gifted with faculties similar to those of the white man ! If the negro teels that friestles is being done him by the supremacy of the Republican party, 'f he thinks that he can decrease his taxes and improve his condition as an individual and a citizen by yeting the Democratic ticket, has he not the right to do so, and is it not natural for him to do so ?

We have read many communications in the past few nonths from segro citizens, announcing their determination to support the Democracy for good reasons, and it is to be presumed that there were many more who did not publish, their intentions.
