THE PROBABLE EUROPEAN WAR.

ITS COMMERCIAL AND INDUSTRIAL EFFECTS.

The San Francisco Journal of Commerce says it now seems to be only a question of time till the dogs of war will be let slip in Europe, and until the splash of arms shall be heard from the shores of the Caspian to the rocks of Gibraltar, Russia will not be ready to move her armies northward to the close of the present month, but then there will be no delay, and there will come the death-struggle of the Mohammedan despotism that has laid waste some of the fairest portions of Europe and Asia for over three hundred years.

All this will produce very considerable commercial changes. Though privateering, British foreign commerce will be forced to be carried on in foreign vessels, mainly French and American, or the English vessels will have to change their flags as they did during the war. In view of this it would be well for Congress to modify the laws so as to allow a ship built in a foreign port to be classed as an American ship on being transferred to the American flag, and held in whole or in part by American owners.

They are the raw material will advance, and the farmers of the United States will again receive prices that they have not received since the war times. A general advance in prices may then be expected as the result of the anticipated war, and contemporaneously, capital will be loosed from its present reservoirs, new enterprises will be entered into, and in the industrial night-mare that has so long oppressed this country, will have passed away. Labor will be employed at remunerative rates, trade will revive and every business will receive an impetus that will sustain it for years to come.

In Europe the possible changes resultant from such a war would be even more noteworthy. With the Russian court at Constantinople and the Turkman expelled from Asia minor, Armenia, Syria, Mesopotamia and Babylonia, these regions would again regain somewhat of their lost wealth and industrial activity, and the Orient of the world's commerce would again be as old as the hills through Bagdad, Babylon, St. Jean d'Acre, which would take the place of the ancient Tyre, and through Constantinople. The old city of the Constantines of the world, would again become the center of European trade with the Eastern world, and from it the commercial current would flow through Vienna to the balance of the commercial States of Europe. Marseilles (Masilias), would assume some of its ancient importance, and Rome would recover somewhat of its ancient trade. Should the result of the war in England be the loss of India and Ireland, that would be equivalent to the loss of her whole foreign trade, as Constantinople would then do the business that London now does, while that of Liverpool and Glasgow would not be long in being transferred to Cork, Galway and Londonderry. Should Poland acquire her independence as a result of the struggle, there would be raised up a new power which would dominate Central Europe and set as a check on Russia and Germany while the increased impetus given to the cultivation of wheat on her humid prairies would do much to render Europe in this important cereal entirely independent of America, which would have to turn its attentions to the development of its manufacturing resources so as to raise up a sufficiently large urban population to consume what cereals could not be exported. In fact, the threatened war would be the greatest that ever afflicted the earth, but did it rescue the fairest regions of the world from the domination of the Turk, and set free populations now held in bondage by the sword, it would be without a brighter side, while the legends given to trade, industry and the acts of peace by a termination in favor of

humanity and liberty, would be felt for many unborn centuries.
