THE USE OF ARMED FORCE EXPECT.

From the London Standard, Nov. 21. If the votes of Florida or Louisi ana should be tainted by fraud, or strong suspicion of fraud or illegality, the House of Representatives, when the votes are to be finally counted and declared on one side or the other, will exercise the right it claims to cast them out. In that case supposing the right to be ad. mitted, Mr. Tilden would be elected. But it is almost equally certain that the Republican majority in the Senate will dispute the claim of the Heuse. The formal duty of declaring the vote belongs to the Presiden t of the Senate, and he, being, of course, a Republican nominee, will very probably, in the last resort, declare Hayes elected in spite of the resistance of the House. In that case there can be little doubt that Gen. Grant would decide the de facto possession of the Presidency and the White House by forcibly keeping the Democrats away at o'clock.
