HORRIBLE ACCIDENT.
Yesterday evening, by the accidental discharge of a shot gun, in the hands of a friend, Mr. Pryor Tunstall was shot and instantly killed. It seems the gun was rusty, and he had been unable to make the breech spring work, and passed it in to the hands of his friend, Mr. Perry, who was trying to throw it open at the breech, when the gun went off and the contents were lodged in the brain of Mr. Tunstall, the charge entering the eye. Mr. Perry was seated in a window while handling the gun, and Mr. Tunstall on a bed, but a few feet distant. Death was instantaneous. Mr. Tunstall's death was held upon the body by Justice Heston, last yesterday evening, and a verdict found in accordance with the following:
TESTIMONY OF WITNESSES.
E. S. Perry being sworn testified:
The deceased had been trying during the day to open his gun, a breech-loader, that would not open. He came to me to help him about 10 o'clock in the afternoon. Not being able to open it, he put some kerosene in it and let it lay, and tried it later. He could not open it, and handed it to me. I took it to the light and sat down in the window, and tried to raise the spring that holds the barrel. While doing so, it went off, and when I looked up I saw deceased where he is now lying. There was no one else in the room. The gun was in my hands when it went off.
J. H. McBride testified:
I have been with Mr. Tunstall for the past few days, and there has been the saddest feelings between him and Mr. Perry. I was not aware that they had the gun. I was in the next room when I heard the report, and went immediately to the room. I directed that everything remain as it was. Everything in the room as just as it was.
Dr. Edward Bennett being duly sworn testified:
I have examined the deceased, and find that his death was occasioned by a gunshot wound in the head, entering the right orbit of the eye and penetrating the brain.
Dr. John Herff testified that he had examined the deceased, and agreed with the above statement of Dr. Bennett.
CORONER'S VERDICT.
State of Texas, County of Bexar:
"At an inquest taken before W. H. Heston, Justice of the Peace and ex-officio Coroner, upon a view of the body of P. Q. Tunstall, by oath of Herman Wegener, Jr., J. A. Crowell, M. Slocum, G. S. Williams, J. J. Dyer, and W. Showalter, being duly sworn, say that P. Q. Tunstall came to his death by the accidental discharge of a shot-gun, which said gun was in the hands of E. S. Perry."

VENTURESOME MORTALS.
Yesterday a few reckless citizens who, relying, we suppose, on their past good character in case of serious accident, ventured on the streets. The man was not on an average more than four inches deep in the thought of trying his skill rather than risk their necks on the things called pavements, a few of which objects of curiosity we have. Well, what is to be done about it? We do not wish to turn ourselves into a patent growling machine, though we are conscious of the support of the community, and the sympathy of all visitors to the city. We do not want to see the subject passed by to a more convenient season. The convenient season has been on the way too long already. The Council should take some steps at once, with a view of remedying the evil. The next meeting will not be too soon. And if there is one among the councilmen more patriotic than another, or more thoroughly disgusted with San Antonio's dirty, muddy, sloppy walks, let him take the matter in hand, and have a reform accomplished—he will not have been elected in vain.

Elsewhere will be found an account of the death of FRYOR CHARLES TUNSTALL, whose life was taken by one of those unfortunate accidents which, under the unsearchable direction of Providence, are permitted to bereave us of the noblest of the world, as well as those bearing the humblest and lower relations.

While we are aware that no words of ours can reach, much less allay, the unfeeling and holy sorrow that has fallen so suddenly, and with such crushing force, upon a family of which he was the worthy pride, we may say, we can not refrain from giving vent to somewhat of our own deep grief, and say a few words of one whom "none knew but to love, nor spoke of but to praise." A nobler specimen of manhood; a more thorough and gallant gentleman, a truer and more devoted friend, it has not been our fortune to meet. God fashions none after a nobler type. FAYOR TUNSTALL was one of those men who did not demand the acquaintance of weeks or months to assure you that he was a gentleman. It came to you as a bright light, it was stamped upon every feature of his face, it breathed in every action of his body. He was a true specimen of a Southern gentleman. His death has made a vacuum in the hearts of his friends that time will refuse to fill. A Kentuckian by birth, his life has been spent in New Orleans, St. Louis, and of late in this portion of Texas. During the late war, he was a Captain in the Confederate army—and a patriot ever drew sword with higher resolve, or followed the fortunes of a flag with no unwavering steadfastness.

The grass will grow green above his grave, his voice will be a remembrance of the past, but with those who knew him, his memory will be green also. Our heartfelt sympathy for his family is intense, for we know what they have lost. In a moment, from them the gladness has been taken out of life. But if ever a spirit was warranted direct to heaven, his soared thitherward when the lamp of life went out. It was happily without a moment's suffering.

Among the sufferers from his untimely death, there can be none so bowed down as the friend who was the accidental instrument of it. His feelings and grief can be but overwhelmed, and deserves the sympathy of everyone. "God gave, and God has taken away." Requiescat in pace.
