THE COMPROMISE BILL

A vote was pressed on the night of the 24th onethe electoral compromise bill in the Senate, resulting in its adoption by a najority of 30 votes. This result has far sore importance attached to it than ever those most sanguinely interested in its passage have any conception of. The only doubts as to the success of the bill existed with the Senate, as the instrument is reparded with greater favor by Demociats ing largely Democratic, is conceded to favor it by an overwhelming majority. Many Democratic members of the Hesse, however, are opposed to it on principle; still the majority favors it as a matter of

expediency. Extreme Republicans oppose it because they say it would elect Tiden; extreme Democrats, because they consider it unconstitutional on principle and a compromise with political highwaymen. The liberal partizans support it because they say, it averts civil war, which point there is no real danger of civil war to be The proposition practically throws the

decision of the presidential question into the hands of five judges of the Supreme Vegetime Court, and is probably the wisest means that could have been resorted to t straighten the entanglement. Some obect to entrusting the question to these udges on the grounds that the choice of a President is a duty they were never inendedeto perform. This idea is imaginary, at heat. The judges of the Supreme Court were intended to discharge any functions Congress might impose upon

them.


