An Appalling Crime—Shocking Mur-der of a Young Girl. [From the Baltimore Gazette.] The police authorities of Balti more City yesterday received the details of a borrible murder com mitted in Jefferson, Texas, on January 21, from J. M. Thomas, chief of Police in that place. A beautiful young lady, apparently not more than twenty years of age, arrived at a hotel there a few days before, accompanied by a man aged about twenty eight years. They regis-tered as "A. Munroe and lady, Cincinati, O." The man left on the 21st

of January, giving Little Rock, Ark., as his destination. The young woman, who was of light auburn hair, and attired richly in black silk, was discovered after ber companion left, murdered in her room. The murderer had battered her face in such a manner as a most to pre vent recognition. Accompanying the letter of the chief of police was a. photograph of the unfortunate woman, which represents a ghastly appearance. Her eyes were gouged out, her face bruised and discolored, and her mouth mashed so as to dis play her teeth. The photograph was taken of the murdered woman as she laid at full length upon her bed, partly dressed, in the position she was in when discovered. It is one of the most striking illustrations of a terrible crime ever received by the police authorities of this city, and so appalling is the appearance of the victim that it will be apt to remain photographed upon the mind of every one who looks upon it. The murderer bas capaped to

parts unknown. That murder will out, this verifies, the man referred to bring the same as above:

man named Abe Rothschild attempted to commit suicide this morning by shooting. It has transpired that he murdered his mis-tress, camed Bessie Moore, in Jettereon, Texas, some time ago, where they had been stopping at a botel. Pothschild was a commercial traveler for a house in this city. His wound is not fatal, and he will be taken to Texas for trial.

Product of A Jersey Herd.

[From the Turt, Field and Farm.] G. A. Pike, of Winthrop, Me., is the fortunate owner of a herd of the fortunate owner of a nerd of eight Maine bred Jersey Herd Book cows, which are highly prized for the quantity and quality of their lacteal supply. Besides the milk and cream used in the family, averaging about five persons, the dairy produced last year 2,337 pounds of butter, which included 137½ product of a farrow cow. After deduct of a farrow cow. After deducting this amount, the average yield of butter per cow was 275 lbs. Samples of this butter took the first premium at the State Fair. There were also raised from these cows five heifer calves, which took more or less new milk trom the dairy. Mr. Pike also slaughtered 1,373 hs. of pork, besides raising a lot of pigs all of which were largely produced from the skim of the milk. 




