EDITORIAL CORRESPONDENCE. FORT STOCKTON, PECOS COUNTY. TEXAS, May 4, 1877. Leaving Fort Concho in the mail coach of the Texas and California Stage Company at 8 A. M. of Istinstant, your correspon dent arrived at this place at 9 P. M of the 2nd, thus making the distance, 170 miles, in thirty-seven hours' Before proceeding, me. however, with a description of the jour ney to this point, some additional notice of Fort Concho, its surroundings, and of Tom Green county, which lack of time while on the ground prevented, is due to that locality, and may prove of interest to pain your readers. Fort Concho is situated on I the brow of a plateau, just above the junction of the middle, or main, Concho and





The intelligent compositor loves nothing so well as to read through the smear this will make across the twenty or thirty words. We have seen him hang over such a piece of copy half an hour, swearing like a pirate all the time, he felt that good.

Don't punctuate. We prefer to

all manuscript sent to as. And don't use capitals. Then we can punctuate and capitalize to suit ourself, and your article, when you see it in print, will astonish you even if it does not please you. Don't try to write too plainly. It is a sign of plebian origin and pub-

lic-school breeding. Poor writing is indication of genius. It is about the only indication of genius that a great many possess. Scrawl your article with your eyes shut and make every word as illegible as you can. We get the same price from the rag man as though it were covered with copper plate sentences. Avoid all painstaking with prop-

er names. We know the full name of every man, woman and child in the United States, and the merest hint at the name is sufficient. For instance, if you write a character of something like a drauken figure "8," and then draw a wavy line, and the letter M and another wav. ing line, we will know at once that you meau Samuel Morrison, even though you may think you mean "Lemuel Messenger." It is a great mistake that proper names should be written plainly.

Always write on both sides of the paper, and wheh you have filled both sides of every page, trail a line up and down every margin, and back to the top of the first page, closing your article by writing your signature just above the date. How we do love to get articles written in this style. And how we would

If you can think of it, lose one page out of the middle of your article. We can easily supply what is miss-ing, and we love to do it. We have nothing else to do!
