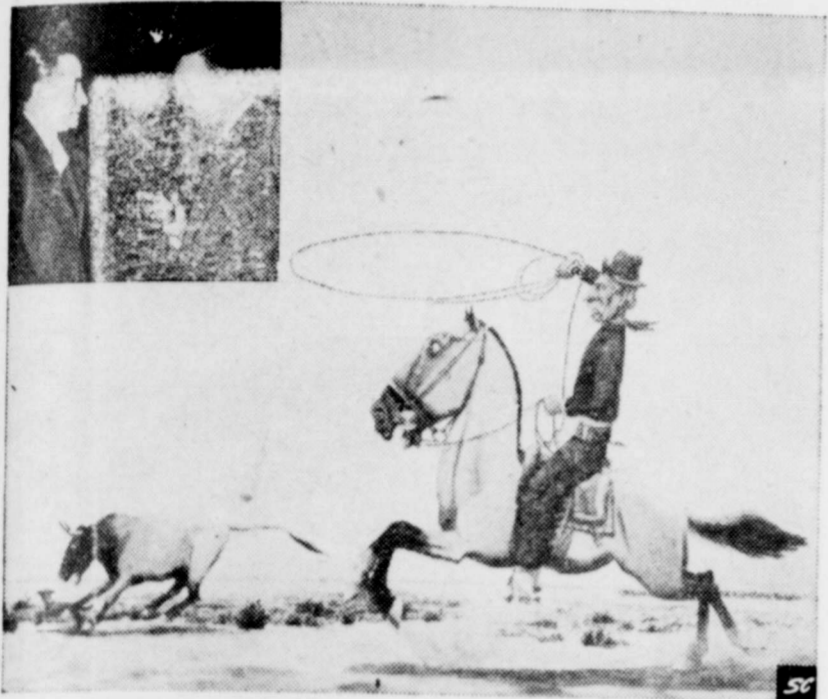

Unique Calendars Help to Promote "Good Neighbor" Policy



MINNEAPOLIS, MINN.—Calendars now are doing their part in promoting the "Good Neighbor" policy with South America. The calendars contain original Gaucho paintings by F. Molina Campos, Argentine humorist, and because of their success in 1944 and 1945 for the third year now are being planned again by the Minneapolis-Moline Power Implement company in 1946. The calendars are so popular that they are considered collectors' items by many.

Taxpaying Time Again

Taxpaying time has arrived once more. A total of \$83,762.96 in taxes are on the rolls to be collected in the Sterling County tax-assessor collector's office, which break down as follows:

A discount of 3 per cent is given for state taxes paid in October, 2 per cent in November, and 1 per cent in December. Attorney General Grover Sellers has ruled that it is not only voluntary, but mandatory that the county give the same discounts. However, Sterling County has never offered such discount, and a test case may be the deciding factor in such a move here.

Soil Supervisors Elected

The election of a Supervisor for zone 2 of the North Concho River Soil Conservation District was held in the District Court Room at Sterling City, Texas on the night of October 2nd.

Foster S. Price was selected as chairman and Roland Lowe as secretary.

L. R. Reed, the incumbent was elected and gave a short talk on the accomplishment to date, and the plans of the supervisors for the future. An open discussion was then held with the big majority of the land owners present participating in a discussion of practices applied and practices needed for a coordinated soil and water conservation plan on all of that zone, district and the nation.

J. H. Taylor of the Soil Conservation Service gave a short talk on the assistance available to the District from the different Federal, State and Private organizations and agencies.

Portrait of a Man:

The namby-pamby treatment accorded Japan has become a bone in the throat of peace. Hirohito has become the fair-haired rat; Jap propagandists drool he is solely responsible for making peace, while the American conquerors sit around twiddling their bayonets. That is just another form of discredited appeasement which incited the war! . . . The impression is being created that the Mikado was just an innocent bystander. Hell, you would think Killer Hirohito was Lord Fauntleroy. Such horse-radish! . . . On Dec. 7, 1943 (the anniversary of Pearl Harbor), the Jap Emperor sent this cable to Hitler: "I express joy to see our goal realized step by step."

Not only is Hirohito being coddled, but the whole Imperial Jap family has been absolved of any war crimes. However, the blood on their filthy paws shows through the white-wash. . . . One of the most bestial crimes in history was the rape of Nanking. Prince Asaka was in command at Nanking when that unspeakable atrocity took place. . . . Asaka is the Mikado's brother!

It is a crazy world. The Greeks who were supposed to be liberated got tougher treatment than the Japs who are supposed to be conquered.

Japs are being treated as chums. Indicted seditionists continue their pro-Nazi sprees. Nazi war prisoners are coddled. Nothing is being done about the Argentinazis and Spanish fascists who aided our enemies. Our diplomats are leery about punishing all war criminals. . . . At the same time, isolationists are slinging slime at FDR. Our Russian ally is being rapped. Some politicians oppose plans to make certain Americans will have jobs.

Berlin newsboy Gladwin Hill relayed this striking contrast between the Soviet's stern realism in Nazi-land and America's hemming and hawing. . . . While the Americans were working out the fine points of a long range program to provide Germans with non-Nazi movies, the Russians blandly authorized German movie houses to reopen with the implicit warning to every German exhibitor that if he peddled any Nazism he might turn up missing.

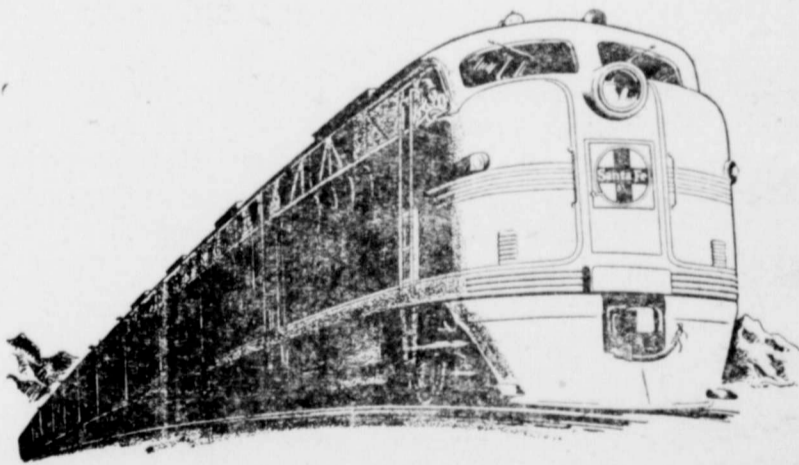

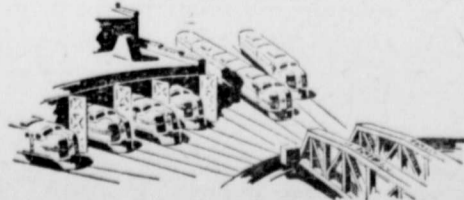

Cross Breed Cattle Success In South



BEEVILLE, TEXAS—A cross between Shorthorn cows and Brahma bulls, such as the herd shown above, is the only successful cross breed to be found to date to be impervious to heat and ticks, chief enemies of good cattle in hot climates. The cross embodies Brahma immunity to heat and ticks, removes the Brahma hump and yet retains all Shorthorn top qualities of modern beef cattle. The herd of 13 heifers shown above, priced at \$550 per head, averages eight months in age and 600 pounds in weight, and is the first shipment on a four year contract by John P. Impson, (inset left), Beeville Shorthorn breeder, and William du Pont, Jr., (inset right). The contract provides for from 80 to 100 heifers which will become the basis for a herd of Santa Gertrudis cattle with the above group going to du Pont's ranch at Carreroft, Del. Other heifers will be shipped in 1945 and 1946 to du Pont ranches in Delaware, Maryland and Florida. There they will be mated with Brahma bulls from the King Ranch, Kingsville, Texas, originators of the Santa Gertrudis breed.
