





TAX FACTS FOR THE HOMEOWNER NO. 4-**Deductions For Car And Home**

(This is one of a series of articles on federal income tax filing. The articles are based on information provided by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Texas Society of Certified Public Accountants, in cooperation with the Internal Revenue Service.)

YOUR home and car may be the source of deductions that will lower your federal income tax. It is important to check all possible deductions because of the savings involved. If you are in the lowest tax bracket - 20 per cent - each \$5 you can find in deductions will mean a dollar in your pocket. For persons of higher income the possible savings are even greater.

The interest on a mortgage is deductible on your federal tax by insurance. Although your return. In most cases, payments driving may have been faulty, to a bank include both interest you are entitled to the deducand principal; as the mortgage tion if the accident was not due is reduced the interest is less, to your willful negligence. and a larger portion is applied to the principal. Only the amount you pay as interest is deductible in the case of your residence.

Real Estate Taxes
