This new leaflet discusses some of the factors that are involved in vertical integration. There are many problems involved in this type operation in wool and lamb production which are not present in other agricultural commodities. Thus far. contract feed ing of lambs is about the only phase of the industry in which this operation is occuring.

Economists point out that the decreasing demand for wool in comparison with competing fibers is causing producers to search for more efficient marketing practices. While the total per capita mill consumption of the three competing fibers. cotton, wool and man-made fibers, was up 21% the increase for cotton was 2% and for wool the increase was 7%. During the same period, the increase for man-made fibers was 235%.



When two or more defendants are involved in a single crime, the total reward is limited to \$500.00, but the conviction of one defendant, even though the other defendants are acquitted. will entitle the claimant or claimants to said sum of \$500.00. All claims must be submitted within ninety (90) days following conviction. If, upon conviction, a defendant confesses other thefts, no additional reward will be paid. All devisions concerning the payment of such reward and the conditions of payment will be made by the Board of




