During the spring show circuit which ended last week with the San Angelo Fat Stock Show, eighteen Sterling County 4-H Club members exhibited 71 head of fat lambs in four shows. In addition, four club members exhibited registered Rambouillet in three shows while four exhibited in the range ewe class at San Angelo. Twenty-three club members had lambs at the county show while four had registered Rambouillets and four had range ewes.

On a breakdown of shows and exhibitors, five club members had five lambs at Odessa, three exhibited in the breeding sheep division there; eight members had 16 lambs at Abilene; five had lambs at San Antonio and three entered the breeding sheep show; eighteen showed 37 lambs in the San Angelo show while four each entered the breeding sheep show and the range ewe show.

In the range ewe class at San Angelo, three of the top eleven groups were bred by Dayton Barrett, Betty Jo Barrett's third place group. FFA member Reynolds Lee Foster's sixth place group and FFA member 11th place group were all from Dayton. Another of the top ten group was bred by his neighbor Charles Probandt and fed and exhibited by a Tom Green County 4-H Club member.

A representative of the Agricultural Research Service spent several days in the county last week contacting ranchers in various parts of the county in regard to the screw-worm situation.

This division of the USDA is working establishment of an overwintering line in Texas for the screwworms as well as other aspects of the screwworm's life cycle. On this trip, Lynn Harden, who is working out of the Ft. Worth office, left bottles or tubes with various ranchers in which they are to collect and send in samples of screwworms when they have cases in livestock. Harden completed this portion of the work in this county on Friday and said that he would probably be back in about two months to see how the situation was progressing.

If you neglected to spray your fruit and nut trees for scale, you can still do it if you hurry. Oil emulsion is the recommended treatment for this pest and can be used only when the trees are dormant. At the time of this writing the buds had not started to swell and it would be safe to use the oil emulsion. If the buds on the trees have started to swell or the shuck started to split, you'd better put it off until next winter unless your trees are very heavily infested with scale. Use 3 1/2 gallons of a 97% oil emulsion in 100 gallons of water.

As soon as your lawn grass begins to grow, apply fertilizer for a pretty lawn. Both Bermuda and St. Augustine should be starting to grow to get the best results from the fertilizer. Most grasses need about two pounds of actual nitrogen; in this area 12 lbs. of 16-20-0 per 1000 square feet of lawn does a good job unless your lawn is badly run down and you want to build it up fast.

An ELECTION-YEAR call for a break-down in our traditional quota method of restricting immigration to this country was made in a special message to Congress last week by President Eisenhower. A similar request was made four years ago. And before that former President Truman called for a vast increase in immigration.

This dramatic action serves to remind us that political leaders will leave no stone unturned in an appeal for minority racial group votes in pivotal areas like New York, Chicago, Detroit, and others. The chances are both major parties will include about the same thing in the platforms when they are drafted this summer.

The President's proposal would allow nearly a half million immigrants to come in annually, and would probably lead to a greater influx. The limit under the quota system at present is 154,000.

As I view this, it is mostly politics. But with so many politicians joining in the clamor it may contain ominous implications. Indeed, once a break-down on restrictions is achieved, America may in the future become a dumping ground for Europe's and Asia's surplus population which in many areas already tax their economies severely. We should retain the present restrictions, and instead of opening the flood gates we would do well to seek means of closing present loopholes in existing laws.

A Washington meeting attended by 3300 AFL-CIO building trades unionists last week provided a forum for four Presidential hopefuls to plug for the union vote. In doing so they seemed to try to out-do each other. Senator Humphrey pointed with pride to his record of voting 213 out of 214 times according to labor's views. Senator Symington cited a record of consistent uniformity in his support. Senator Kennedy pointed to his record for labor and social justice as being about second to none. A fourth Senator turn-coat Wayne Morse, bragged about voting against the Landrum-Griffin bill last year which cramps the style of the racketeers in the labor movement.

Not invited were Dick Nixon and Lyndon Johnson, reportedly too moderate for the extremist liberal union leaders.

## Gunn Is Arraigned For Trial Here on April 18

Riley Edward Gunn was arraigned for murder here Monday and trial was set for April 18 by District Judge Joe L. Mays Monday.

A special venire of 85 jurors was set up and Judge Mays appointed Royal Hart as the court appointed defense attorney.

Gunn had been indicted for the beating murder of Cecil Edward Grady near here on January 15.

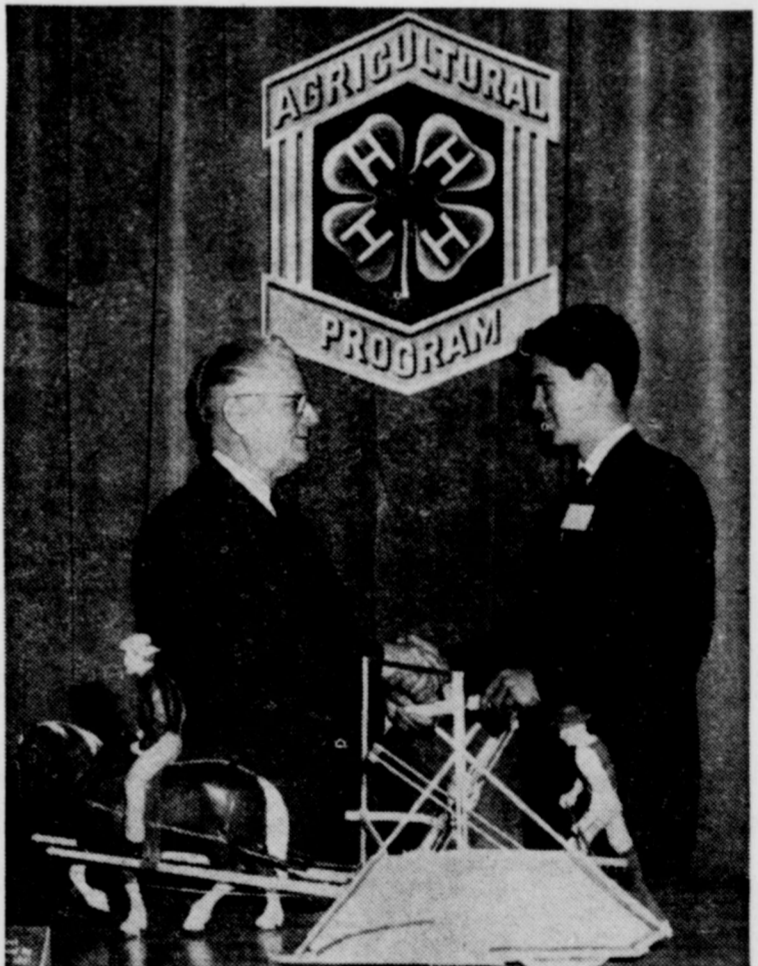

## 4-H Boys' Agricultural Awards Winner

Roy Dee Gregg, 17, of Route 3, Plainview, Hale County, Tex., was one of six young 4-H Club members singled out for special honors during the 38th National 4-H Club Congress just held in Chicago.

Roy, as did five other national winners, received an all-expense trip to the congress and also was awarded a \$400 International Harvester scholarship as a result of his outstanding record in agricultural projects.

The objectives of the program, known as the National Boys' 4-H Agricultural Awards, are to develop leadership and gain a better knowledge of those agricultural projects and activities which contribute to better farming and a more satisfying rural life.

Arranged and announced by the National Committee on Boys and Girls Club Work, the program is sponsored by International Harvester Company and conducted by extension services of state agricultural colleges and the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Roy, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Melvin Gregg, is a senior at Plainview High School. He has

spent eight years in 4-H club work and is a member of the County Wide Club.

Working on 4-H projects came naturally to Roy since his older brothers were active members and his father an adult leader. This year he carried out six major projects, including steers, lambs, calves, grain, garden and cotton.

In addition to earning a profit of nearly \$7,000 from his 4-H projects, Roy has won numerous awards and ribbons for a variety of activities. In 1959, he was a judge on the first place team at the El Paso Fat Stock Show and took high individual honors in that event.

Roy likewise has been a member of the first place livestock judging team at the Texas State Fair and has been winning prizes for his cotton since 1953.

A past president of both his local and county clubs, Roy is a member of the American Junior Rodeo Association and is active in church and community work. He lives on his parents' 500-acre farm.

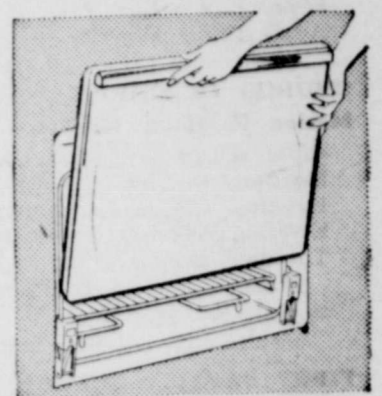
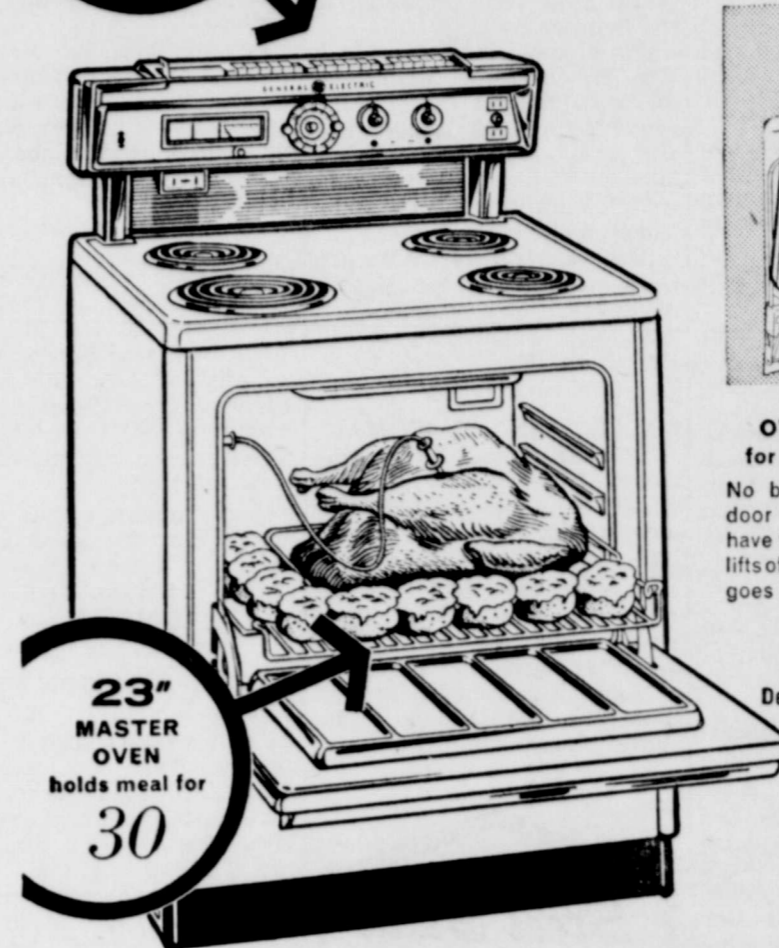

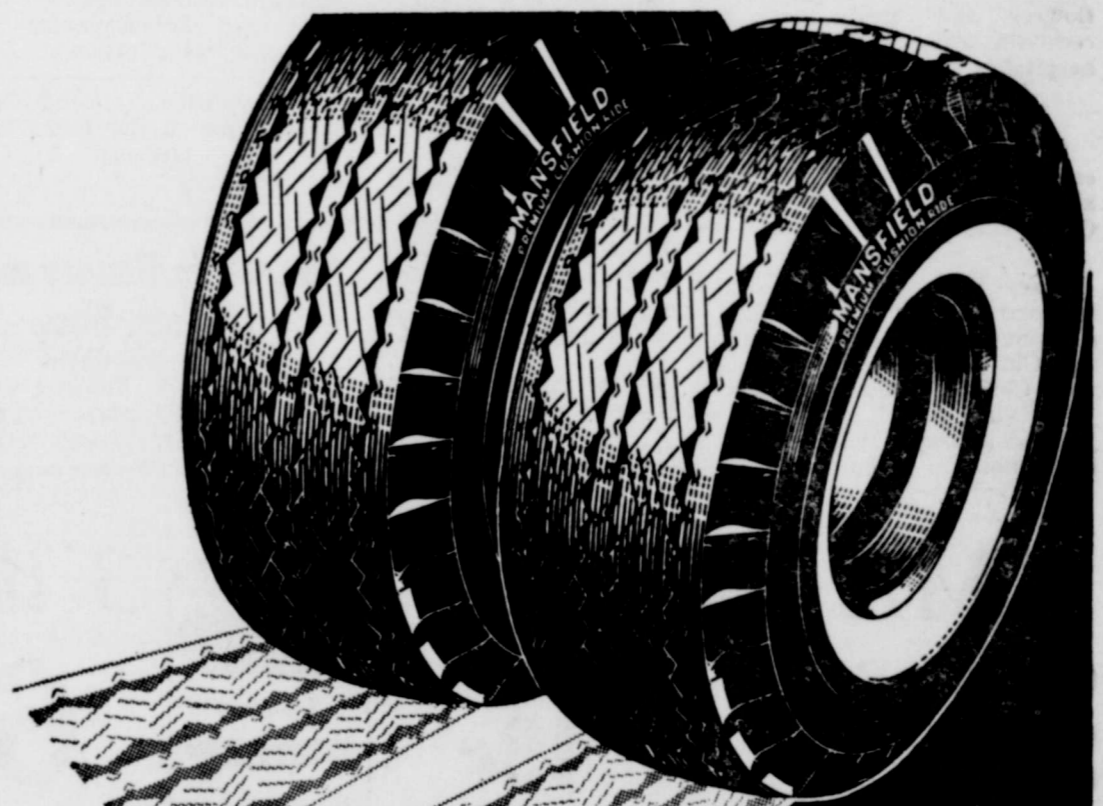
