People and fish have a lot in

This fact becomes evident when you glance around your town, and note people's habits. On the hot afternoons you'll find them in the air-conditioned buildings, huddled around a whirling fan, or hunkered in the shade. Only the foolish youngsters will be dashing about in the sun.

But, in the evenings things begin to happen. People move out into their backyards to barbecue the evening meal, they flock to the drive-in movie, or they catch up on the little chores that must be done around house and yard.

Despite their many differences, fish have approximately



same hot-weather habits that people do. Because they have no eyelids, the bright sunshine hurts their eyes. So they retire to deep water or the shade of an undercut bank dur-ing the heat of the day. If a lake is spring fed, they'll congregate around these cooler

In the early morning or evening, they begin to move around, too. These are the times game fish are on the prowl for food, and it's the time you should be out on the water with a fishing rod in your hand. Most anglers know this, but I thought you'd like to know

Thinking like a fish isn't difficult after all.

Do-It-Yourself Float Trip If you own an outboard motor, I suggest you try your hand at a backyard float fish-

ing trip.
Select your stream first.
Pick one which has enough water to float you, and one that has a minimum of shoals or riffles. In all probability, you can find such a stream close to your home.

Then, gather your equipment together. You'll need a boat, preferably a large canoe or "John" type boat, a matching outboard, paddles, sleeping and cooking equipment, and a supply of food. At this season, you'll also need a cooler full of ice. And, don't forget your fishing tackle.

If a weekend is all the time you have, select a campsite that can be reached by road, and put your boat in the water Friday evening. Do your camp chores before dark, but try to reserve an hour or so for some late evening fishing.

The next morning, head upstream under power. Start at dawn, and run for at least an hour before you shut off your motor and commence to drift back toward camp. On the way up, look for and memorize the location of the best fishing spots. Keep your eyes open for deep pools, undercut banks springs, and junctions of smaller streams, and fish these spots thoroughly as you drift downstream.


The following day, start drifting from camp and fish the downstream portion of the river. With your camp as headquarters you can fish the river in both directions, and find spots that few other anglers have explored.

The most important item in a do-it-yourself float trip is your outboard motor. Your power plant should be properly matched with your boat, but more important, it should be designed for the abuse frequently encountered in river navigation. It should have a tough lower unit, and a propeller as-sembly equipped with a slip-clutch arrangement.

Frankly, the Mercury outboard is the only motor able to grind through gravel bars and bounce off rocks without shearing a pin or damaging a prop. These motors don't have any pins to shear, and their slanted lower units glide over obstructions with ease.

Thusly equipped, you'll have a wonderful time on a do-ityourself float. You'll fish new waters, explore different country, and probably catch more fish than you have in a long


