The Spreme Court showed ome signs of being judicial minded in a 5 to 4 decision the other day which upheld a contempt of Congress conviction of two men who refused to answer questions asked by the House Un-American Activities Committee. They had been qestioned about subversive connections.

As you might expect, the dissent came from Justices Black, Brennan and Chief Justice Warren. This decision may indicate a switch in the balance of power on the Court in favor of the moderate-conservative wing that does not choose to treat the communists as just another political party but rather as a menace and a conspiracy.
