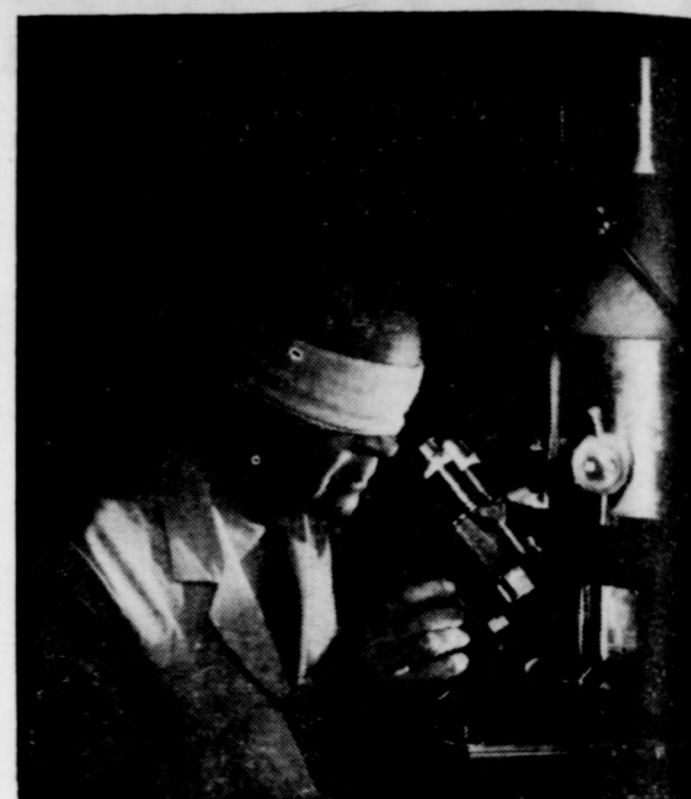

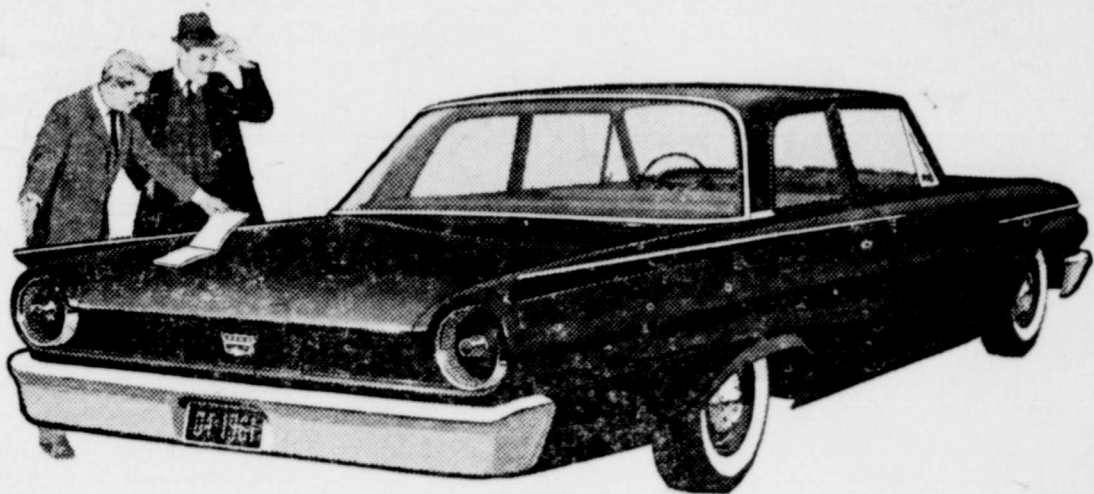
Avocado Sea Food Salad

THE PLAINS INDIANS

(Continued from last week)
 By 7th Grade History Club

THE COMANCHE INDIANS

The Comanche Indians were a tribe of buffalo hunting Indians who roamed the southern plains from Kansas to Mexico. They raided the Spanish ranches for horses and became the most expert of all Indian horsemen. It is reasonable to assume that the Comanches found it necessary to become horsemen to compensate for their short legs. Being poor walkers they had to become good riders. They soon came to hate walking, just as the cowboys did, and like the cowboys they looked—and were—awkward on the ground.

The Comanches rode bareback, but kept a loop of horsehair braided into a pony's mane. When enemy arrows came thick, the naked warrior would throw his body into this loop and ride against the horse's side or even underneath him, keeping only one heel on the horse's back for support. In this position it is said he could shoot as straight as though he sat upright.

The Comanches were the terror of Texas ranches where they would swoop down at night, yelling and waving blankets to stampede the horses. The Comanche accepted a reservation in 1878 and became farmers and cattlemen.

APACHE

Apache, a group of tribes, with the Navaho, the southern division of the Athapascan linguistic family. In historic times, they ranged over most of New Mexico and Arizona, northern Mexico, and parts of Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Colorado and Utah. The Apache tribes had no political connection and often were at war among themselves. There is little agreement on classifying them, but an accepted grouping is: Chiricahua, Pinalon, Arivaipa, Coyotero, including White Mountain and Pinal divisions; Gila Apaches, including Gileno, Mimbreno, Mogollone, and Tonto; and Quechero or Vaquero, including Mescalero, Jicarilla, Faraone, Llanero, and probably Lipan, sometimes regarded as a separate branch of the Athapascan family. White Mountain at Fort Apache agency was later governmental designation, but several tribes were represented at both agencies.

The Dress of the Apaches
 The Apaches wore buckskins like the Plains Indians, but with high mountaineer's moccasins coming to their knees. Their hair was long and flowing, sometimes topped with a knot of feathers.

Life of the Apaches
 The Apache were mountaineers and hunters. They scattered through New Mexico, living on game and such wild plants as they could get. When hunting was poor, they raided the peaceful Indians and later the Spaniard's ranches. Those in New Mexico lived in teepees and soon learned to hunt buffalo on horseback. Their women did fine handiwork on buffalo hides, and they do today. Those in the mountains of Arizona lived in brush huts and their wom-

en learned basketry from Papago and Pima captives. Their new life was hard and there were many misunderstandings.

Cochise was the chief of the Chiricahuas.

Geronimo was a medicine man and a minor Chiricahua leader.

Apache reservations are at Fort Apache, Fort McDowell, San Carlos and Camp Verde, Arizona, and the Jicarilla and Mescalero agencies, New Mexico. Total population in 1945 was 8,996.

The Apache tribes moved in this location to San Antonio to Del Rio up the Rio Grande to El Paso.

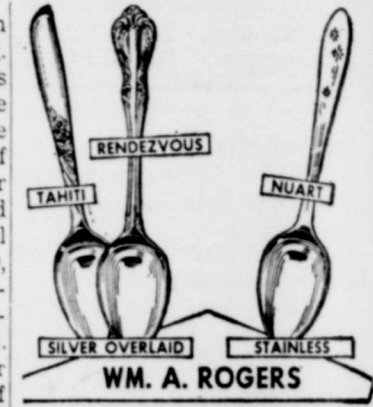

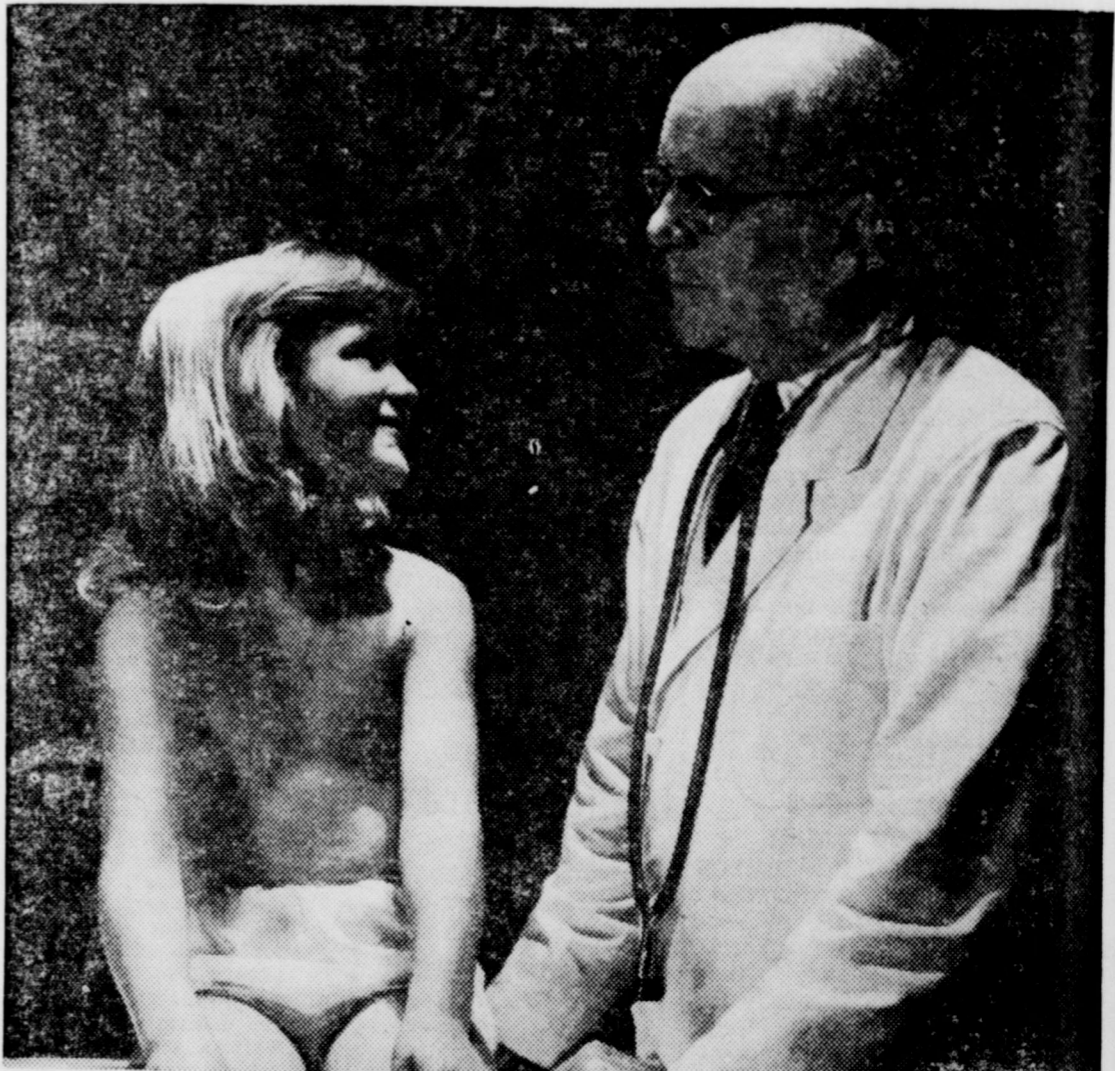
