At this time of the year, going to college or quitting education and securing a job. The Pennsylvania State College of Agricultural says that a college education will pay the average ranch or farm boy 18 times what he invests in it.

It is worth \$40 per day for a boy to finish high school; he may expect to earn \$33,000 more in his lifetime by graduating from high school. If he graduates from college he may expect to earn \$72,000 more. Each day of 250 days spent in college earned an additional income of \$72 for rural boys. Although no figures are given for girls, the situation would be similar.

HONORED WITH PARTY ON 25th ANNIVERSARY OF TEACHING



Y. Benge Estate (c-o W. Y. Benge, Jr.) was originally filed with the Commission by T. H. Johnson on June 25, 1914, and declared the intent to appropriate 14 acre-feet of water per annum from the North Concho River for the purpose of irrigating 7 acres of land in the N.W. corner of Section 35, Block 14, S.P. 2 egg whites; 11/2 cups sugar; 1/8 teaspoon salt; 1/3 cup water; 2 tablespoons light corn syrup; Flake Coconut.

Combine egg whites, sugar, salt, water, corn syrup, and honey in top of double boiler. Beat 1 minute until thoroughly mixed. Cook over rapidly boiling water, beating constantly with sturdy egg beater (or at high speed of electric beater) 7 minutes. Remove from boiling water. Add vanilla and beat 1 minute or until thick enough to spread. Frost cake and sprinkle with flaked coconut. Makes 51/4 cups frosting or enough to cover generously tops and sides of two 9-inch layers.
