



If you are self-employed, you are responsible for the correctness of your own social security account, explained Floyd B Ellington, District Manager of the San Angelo office of the Social Security Administration. Filing complete and correct tax returns will assure you of receiving correct social security bene-

He should make sure his social security number is shown in item 4 of Form SE (attachment to Schedule C or Schedule F). He should file his tax returns on time. 




