Cox Gets 3 More Votes Than Demo

Demos Carry All Other Races

Voters Favor Three Amendments Here

Sterling County voters gave Republican Jack Cox three more votes than they gave the Democrat John Connally, 138 to 135. Carswell got two votes on the Constitution label.

All other Democrats got the nod from voters here all the way down the ticket. There were no opposed county or precinct races, and those locals got the nod all the way.

Three amendments got majorities from Sterling voters. Voters approved the welfare increase, the emergency succession of officeholders and the veterans land resale. All other amendments received negatives here. State-wide most amendments carried but the one allowing trials from authority or board decision, was beaten worst.

For lieutenant Governor of Texas, Preston Smith got 201 votes to Republican Hays 90. Waggoner Carr received 212 for attorney general to Kennerly 95. Joe Pool for Congressman at large got 166 to 118 for Des Barry, his Republican opponent.

Congressman O.C. Fisher of this district fared best of all as a Demo. He got 255 votes to 36 for Republican Mayer.

State Senator Dorsey Hardeman got 231 votes to Lane 53, and Penrose Metcalf got 237 to 51 for Collins in the race for State School Board.

Statewide Connally was elected governor over Cox by about 205,000. All state offices went to Demos, but several Republicans will go to the National Congress.

In the courthouse voting box Cox and Connally tied with 94 votes each.

Historic Medallion For House Here

The County Historical Society has voted to put a historic medallion on the residence just east of R.P. Browns house here in town. The house was built in Montvale around 1870 and was moved to Sterling City in 1881. None of the lumber went through a lumber mill—it was all rough and the nails are the old square ones, say the Browns.

The society also is to replace the bronze marker on the Camp Elizabeth historical marker about seven miles up the Big Spring highway. Vandals have removed the bronze marker or plaque from the face of the monument—that was erected in 1936 by the State Centennial Commission.

The house here in town to be marked by a medallion is owned by the Browns.

John J. Bugg Honored In Arizona

Arizona State Highway Commission chairman John J. Bugg was honored with a testimonial dinner recently in his home town of Florence, Arizona. Bugg, formerly of Sterling County, is soon to retire from the commission and the banquet honored him for his service on that body.

Several hundred persons attended the banquet and gifts were presented to Mr. Bugg. Vierling Kersey, former superintendent of schools of Los Angeles, Calif. was the main speaker for the evening.

The affair was sponsored by the Florence Chamber of Commerce. Jack Williams, former mayor of Phoenix, was toastmaster.

At the State Extension Conference in College Station last week, a former Sterling County agent was commended by the head of the Texas Department of Corrections at Huntsville. Dr. George Beto, head of the prison system commended Byron Frierson who is in charge of the agricultural program. Frierson left Sterling County and has been with the prison system for 13 years.

In that time, the farm system has gone from a deficit operation to one that is paying its way and making money. Dr. Beto stated that prisoners in the Texas system are fed for 13½ cents per day, the lowest in the country. For this amount the prisoners are fed a balanced diet and one that enables them to perform a day's work. He said that much of the credit for this is due to Frierson's management of the farm system. Milk, meat, and vegetables are produced for the tables. Cotton, rice, and other products are produced for the market.

An animal of the breed that helped to build the Texas Livestock industry contributed to ridding it of one of the worst pests in San Antonio on October 25. A 22 year old Texas Longhorn steer was sold for \$82.18 at the Union Stockyards in San Antonio and the money he brought was donated to the screwworm eradication program by its owner, Rocky Reagan, a Live Oak County rancher.

On the same day, the Stockyards donated 50 cents per head on 4,871 head of cattle that went through the auction at the yards. This amount will help the Southwestern Animal Health Research Foundation towards its goal of \$3 million for the screwworm eradication program. Another boost of \$5,000 came when Uvalde's First State Bank contributed that amount to the Uvalde County drive. Dolh Briscoe, Jr. also made a personal contribution of \$1,500 to the drive in that county.

Uvalde county hunters are also being asked to contribute. They are being asked to contribute \$5 each to the drive. Sportsmen will receive many benefits from the program.

The junior high team had a successful season, winning all games but one, and that was a tie with Silver, early in the season.

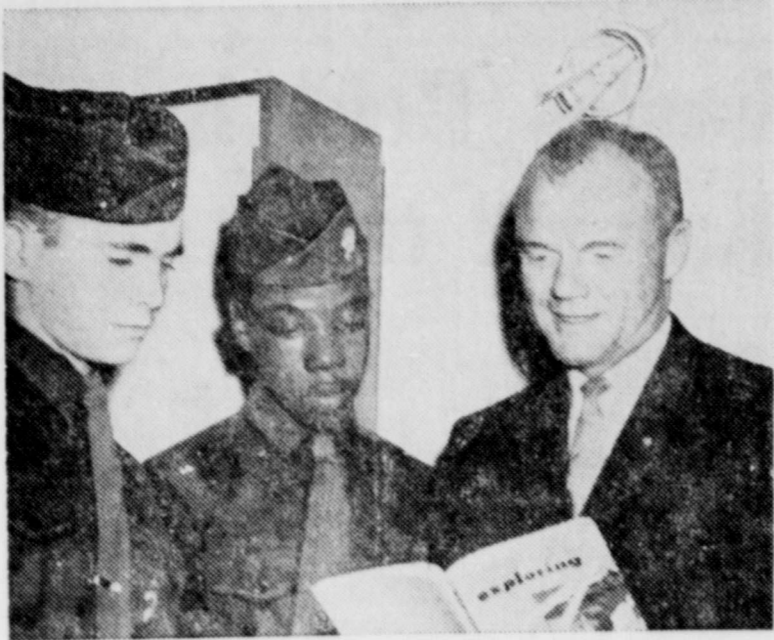
Teen Age Canteen?

Navy Now Accepting Three Year Enlistments

The Navy will accept volunteers for the first year term enlistment and will permit certain young men to reenlist for two or three years in an experimental program. Vice Admiral William R. Smedberg, III, Chief of Naval Personnel announced today.

The experimental program has been placed in operation, Admiral Smedberg said, to meet the increased readiness posture of the Navy and the Nation. It will remain in effect until June 30th, 1962. The three year enlistment program is open to men who have had no prior military training. Under the reenlistment program, eligible personnel who have been released from active duty may reenlist with an option of up to 30 days advance leave. Formerly, broken service men reenlisted for four or six years with no advanced leave authorized. Admiral Smedberg said this new experimental program would afford young men of the country an opportunity to train and serve patriotically while learning of Navy life with only a three year commitment.

The experimental program will in no way effect the Navy's current stay in school policy, young men will continue to be encouraged to stay in school.

Social Security

Over fifty million people have worked long enough under social security to qualify for cash disability benefits if they become disabled. This means that they have social security credits for five years (20 quarters) out of the past ten years, Floyd B. Ellington, district manager of the San Angelo Social Security office said. In the case of a severe disability, the worker and his dependents may be eligible for monthly cash social security disability benefits if he meets this work requirement.

It is not necessary to be completely helpless to qualify for social security disability benefits. These benefits are payable to those who suffer from a crippling disease or a severe impairment which makes them unable to do any substantial work.

Disabled adult sons and daughters of retired, deceased, or disabled workers may also receive childhood disability benefits if they become disabled before they reached age 18.

Anyone suffering a severe disability which prevents him from doing any substantial work should get in touch with the local social security office to determine his eligibility under the Social Security disability program, Ellington stated. He may be losing benefits if he fails to apply for them promptly. The social security district office will explain to disabled workers and their families their rights under the law.

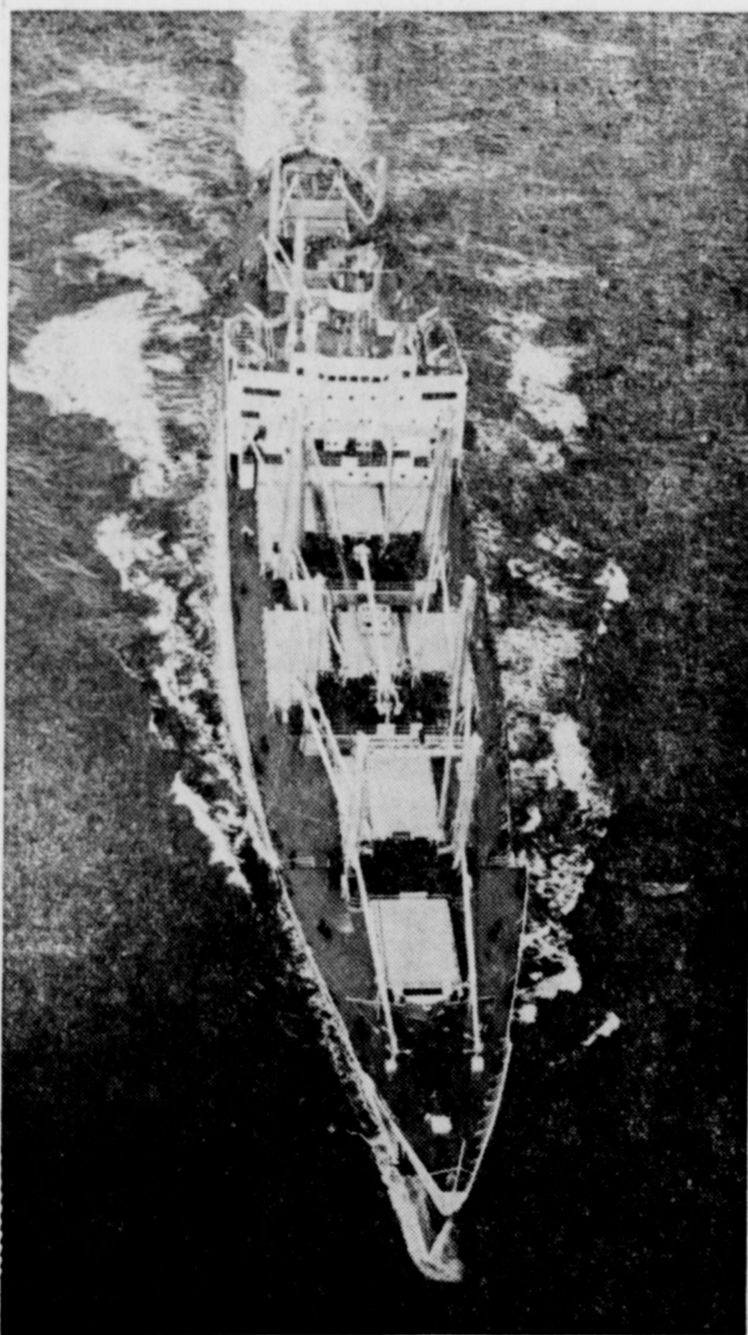

S.S. American Challenger Sets Speed Record

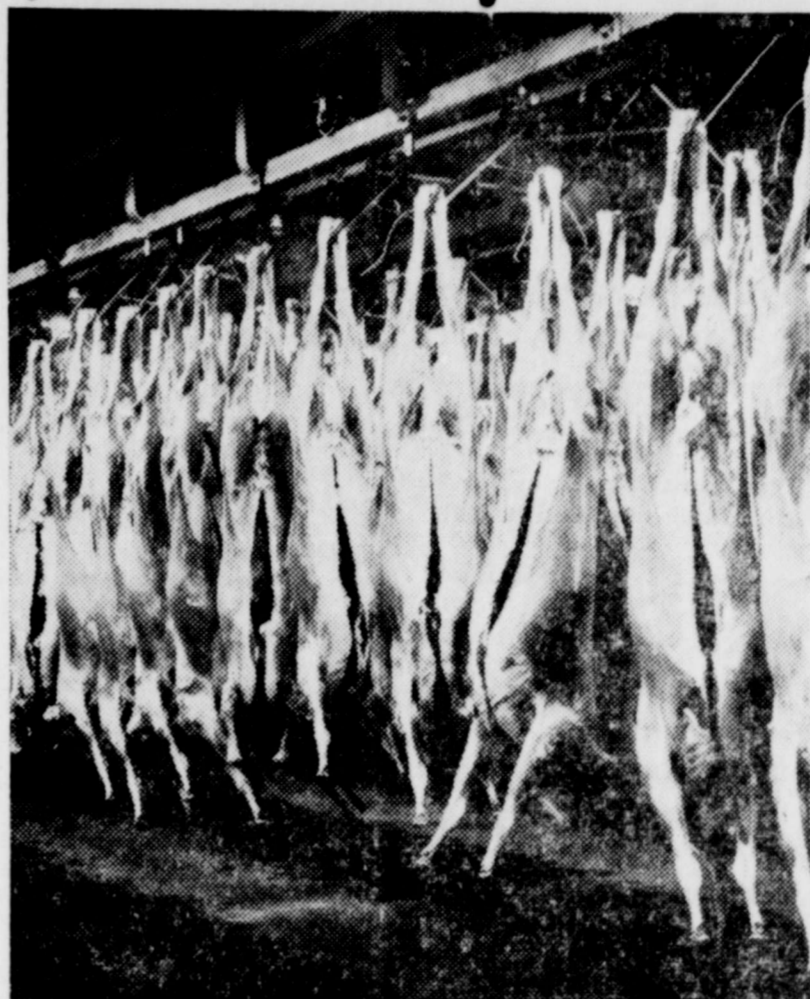

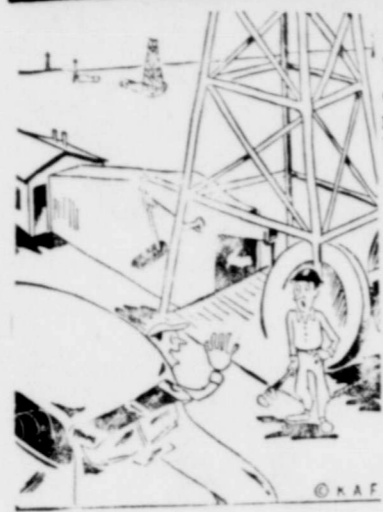

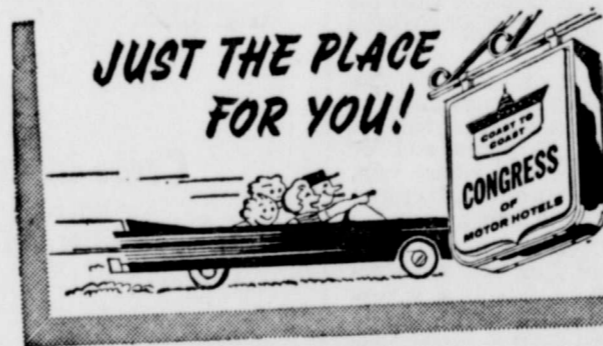
