AROUND THE COUNTY

The San Angelo Fat Stock Show next week marks the end of the show circuit for this year for Sterling County's 4-H Club members. San Angelo's 30th annual show dates for this year are March 6-10. All livestock must be in place by Wednesday morning; the livestock will leave Sterling City Tuesday afternoon.

Schedule of events for the San Angelo show are as follows: Wednesday, weighing, classifying, sifting of fat stock; judging of the Delaine, Rambouillet, and Suffolk sheep open classes and judging of the junior division of the quarter horse show; Thursday, fat lamb show, cutting horse contest, Junior Rambouillet show, Junior Hereford, Angus and Suffolk show; Friday, Junior range ewe lamb show, steer show, Dorset show, continuation of Junior Rambouillet show, Junior Angora goat and Junior Delaine show; Saturday, livestock and grass judging contests and sale.

Sterling County 4-H Club members have entered a variety of livestock in the show. Entrants and their entries are as follows: Betty Jo Barrett, three Rambouillet rams, three Rambouillet ewes; Billy Blank, two crossbred lambs, one finewool lamb; Jay Clark, two finewool lambs, three range ewes; Diana Cole, two quarterhorses, two Angora does; Mackey McEntire, two finewool lambs, one crossbred; Pam McEntire, two finewool lambs; Charlotte Foster, two finewool lambs; Gary Foster, two Suffolk rams, one Suffolk ewe; Rosanne Foster, two finewool lambs; Tommy Foster, two finewool lambs, one crossbred; Janis Igo, two finewool lambs, two crossbred lambs, three range ewes; James Morgan, two crossbred lambs; Mike Payne, one crossbred lamb; Butch Seago, two finewool lambs. This makes a total of seventeen finewool lambs, nine crossbred lambs, three Angora goats, six Rambouillet, three Suffolks, two quarterhorses and two groups of junior range ewes.

Sterling County livestock producers present at the report meeting on the screw-worm eradication program voted to make another voluntary payment on their stock Monday night. Currently, the Southwest Animal Health Research Foundation is busy raising another million dollars for the screw-worm eradication program in Texas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Arkansas. The producers present voted to make the full payment of fifty cents on cattle and horses, ten cents on sheep and goats. As of Wednesday noon, \$2,088 had been raised in the present drive.

It is necessary to raise the million dollars before March 1 if the program is to continue in operation. Only two million dollars of the pledged 3 million dollars in producers funds has been raised.

Many counties are presently working on their first drive. Sterling County initially contributed more than their potential based on the 1959 census. And, unlike many other counties who did raise more than their potential, every producer in Sterling County contributed.

Since the program started operations on February 14, 1962, over two billion sterile flies have been released. The Mission plant is currently raising about 75 million flies weekly; last weeks total was just a little over 69 million.

One of the big bills for the plant is food for rearing the flies. Over 48 tons of meat are required weekly. In addition, 13,000 gallons of water and 5,000 gallons of blood are required to make the food mix-

Clean Up Campaign Set for March 16

A city wide clean up for the town has been set for March 16—a Saturday. All the clubs of the town are sponsoring the clean up and hope to make the town more attractive, eliminate fire hazards and help rid insect breeding places in the coming spring and summer season.

The committees of the various clubs met Tuesday afternoon to map out the campaign and they hope each property owner will be responsible for his own property. All rubbish should be boxed or sacked up for easy hauling that day. All trash and rubbish should be burned and the remainder hauled off to the local dump grounds.

If any lot owners want to burn off the weeds on their property, they should get in touch with the fire department and have a truck handy and burn off their lots.

Some money will be needed to help pay workers on absentee owners lots and if anyone wants to help out on such expenses, they are requested to mail or give check to Mrs. Bill Reed.

C.W.B. Collyns Dies in Fort Worth

Funeral services were held Wednesday afternoon in Fort Worth for Charles Weldon Bayly Collyns, 90, who once owned the 7 Cross Ranch covering more than 220,000 acres in Tom Green, Sterling and Coke Counties.

Services were held in the Ray Crowder Funeral Home and burial was in Ft. Worth's Greenwood Cemetery.

Mr. Collyns, known to his many friends as Uncle Charlie, apparently suffered heart seizure Monday morning in downtown Fort Worth. He was dead on arrival at a Ft. Worth hospital.

A native of Dolverton, England, he was brought to the United States in January 1891 by his father.

Mr. Collyns operated the gigantic ranch until prior to World War I when it was sold to the Mason Perry Co. for \$6 an acre. He had originally paid 27 cents an acre for the land.

His wife, the former Pearl Collins, died in 1954.

Mr. Collyns was a member of the St. Andrews Episcopal Church in Fort Worth and a senior member of the Fort Worth Farm and Ranch Club.

His only immediate survivors are a son, Cecil Collyns of Fort Worth, and a brother, Dr. John M. Collyns of Tunbridge Wells, Kent, England. Several more distant relatives live in West Texas. A brother-in-law, Tom Collins, lives in Sterling.

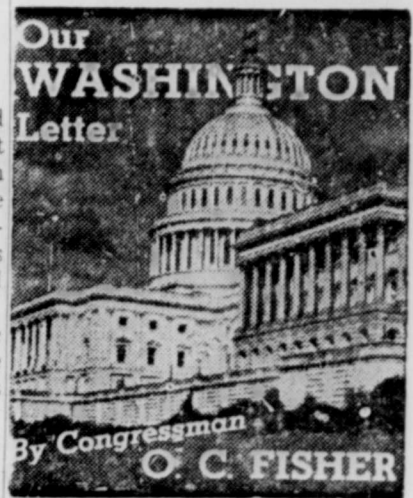
Jeannine Jones Elected Vice-President of Sorority

Two big issues - Aid to Education and Medicare -- have now been tossed into Congressional waters, with a big splash. An "all or nothing" omnibus education program was sent to Capitol Hill by President Kennedy. The 24-point \$5.3 billion package touches every level of education, from kindergartens to public libraries to graduate schools. The one-shot technique, containing something for everyone, immediately came under fire in Congress.

While admitting that classroom construction has been impressive in recent years, sponsors of the new federal aid project express fear that another shortage may crop up later -- and they say they want to be prepared to meet it with federal funds.

A general school aid bill was defeated in the House last year, after being passed in the Senate, when a majority of members, acting on a wide variety of motivations, turned thumbs down on it. Many Catholics opposed it because it failed to include funds for their church schools. A few liberals voted against it because it did not prohibit the use of funds for segregated schools. And a good many of us voted against it because of shortage of federal funds and attempted intrusion into local affairs. It is generally admitted that federal aid would inevitably lead to a measure of federal control in the local schools.

What will happen this year is anybody's guess. It will be a see-saw battle, with the chances fairly good that the package bill will be cut to pieces.

The President's Medicare bill was sent to Capitol Hill last week. A \$2.5 billion measure, calling for an increase in taxes in that amount, faces an uncertain fate. Since the issue involves politics and emotion, a bitter fight is sure to develop.

Some analysts think the public has become increasingly wary of political medicine, and is shying from this revolutionary program. Sponsors have frankly admitted that this is but the beginning of an ambitious expansion of medicare, and apparently the grand design is to eventually apply it to everyone -- not just the aged. That would be in accord with the British socialized medicine.

About these postage increases, some wag has quipped: "I keep wondering whether the Government cleared them ahead of time with U.S. Steel."

For a Beautiful Cake!

HEAVENLY frosting, delicately honey-flavored, and covered with frosty-white flaked coconut, makes a "beauty" out of the simplest of cakes! You can use bakers' cake layers; or you can make layers or a large loaf from a mix, or from your own favorite recipe.

Coconut Honey Frosting

2 egg whites; 1 1/2 cups sugar; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 1/4 cup water; 2 tablespoons light corn syrup; 2 tablespoons honey; 1/2 teaspoon vanilla; 3/4 cup Angel Flake Coconut.

Combine egg whites, sugar, salt, water, corn syrup, and honey in top of double boiler. Beat 1 minute until thoroughly mixed. Cook over rapidly boiling water, beating constantly with sturdy egg beater (or at high speed of electric beater) 7 minutes. Remove from boiling water. Add vanilla and beat 1 minute or until thick enough to spread. Frost cake and sprinkle with flaked coconut. Makes 5 1/4 cups frosting or enough to cover generously tops and sides of two 9-inch layers.

Make A New Marmalade

MAKE the most of the citrus crop and make batches of delicious Marmalade. Wonderful for topping on puddings, or ice cream... good idea for a "hostess gift."

Three-Fruit Marmalade
3 cups prepared fruit (1 orange, 1 lemon, 1 small grapefruit); 5 cups (2 1/4 lbs.) granulated sugar; 1/2 bottle Certo fruit pectin.

Remove skins in quarters from the fruit. Lay flat; shave off and discard about half of white part. With a sharp knife slice remaining rind very fine. Add 1 1/2 cups water and 1/4 teaspoon soda; bring to a boil; simmer, covered 20 minutes, stirring occasionally. Chop peeled fruit; discard seeds. Add pulp and juice to undrained cooked rind. Simmer, covered, 10 minutes longer. Measure 3 cups into a very large saucepan.

Add sugar to fruit in saucepan and mix well. Place over high heat, bring to a full rolling boil; boil hard 1 minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and at once stir in Certo. Skim foam with metal spoon. Stir and skim by turns for 7 minutes to prevent floating fruit. Ladle into glasses. Cover with 1/4 inch hot paraffin. Makes 7 medium glasses.

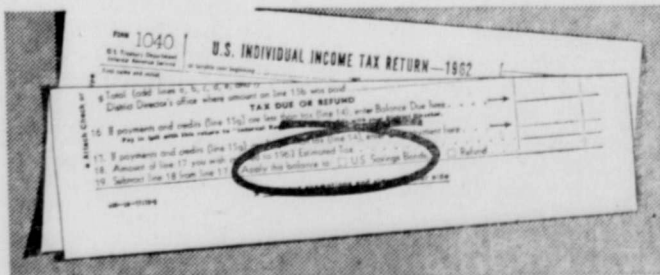

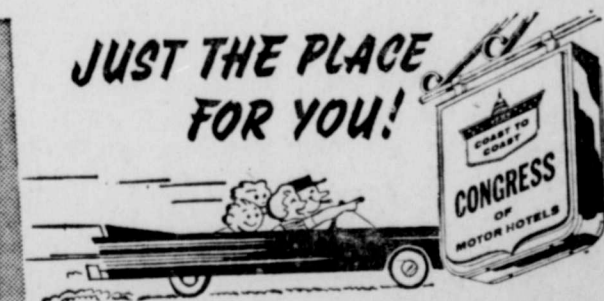

A reward of \$500.00 will be paid by the Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Association to any person (other than law enforcement officers) giving information causing the arrest and final conviction of any person or persons found butchering or stealing any sheep or lambs or goats belonging to any Association member in good standing. When two or more persons give information, the above sum will be divided at the discretion of the Board of the Association. When two or more defendants are involved in a single crime, the total reward is limited to \$500.00, but the conviction of one defendant, even though the other defendants are acquitted, will entitle the claimant or claimants to said sum of \$500.00. All claims must be submitted within ninety (90) days following conviction. If, upon conviction, a defendant confesses other thefts, no additional reward will be paid. All deviations concerning the payment of such reward and the conditions of payment will be made by the Board of Directors of the Association.

Civil Service

The United States Civil Service Commission has announced a new examination for Transmitter and Receiver Operator and Maintenance Technician for filling positions in field locations of the U.S. Information Agency's Voice of America program. The positions to be filled pay from \$3.05 to \$4.49 an hour and are located at Greenville, North Carolina and Honolulu, Hawaii. In filling the positions in Honolulu, preference in certification will be given to persons living in Hawaii.

The Voice of America broadcast operations are on a 24-hour, 7-day week basis. Assignments to these positions will be made to an 8-hour, 5-day shift based upon a flexible schedule subject to change. Shift assignments are made in accordance with broadcasting schedules.

To qualify, applicants must have had responsible experience in the operation and maintenance of broadcasting and receiving equipment which demonstrates a thorough knowledge of radio transmitter operations. Full details concerning requirements to be met are given in Announcement No. 283 B.

Applications will be accepted until further notice and must be filed with the Executive Secretary, Board of U.S. Civil Service Examiners, U.S. Information Agency, Room 2733 Tempo R Building, Washington 25, D.C. For Social Security

Over fifty million people have worked long enough under social security to qualify for cash disability benefits if they become disabled. This means that they have social security credits for five years (20 quarters) out of the past ten years. Floyd B. Ellington, district manager of the San Angelo Social Security office said. In the case of a severe disability, the worker and his dependents may be eligible for monthly cash social security disability benefits if he meets this work requirement.

It is not necessary to be completely helpless to qualify for social security disability benefits. These benefits are payable to those who suffer from a crippling disease or a severe impairment which makes them unable to do any substantial work.

Disabled adult sons and daughters of retired, deceased, or disabled workers may also receive childhood disability benefits if they become disabled before they reached age 18.

Anyone suffering a severe disability which prevents him from doing any substantial work should get in touch with the local social security office to determine his eligibility under the Social Security disability program, Ellington stated. He may be losing benefits if he fails to apply for them promptly. The social security district office will explain to disabled workers and their families their rights under the law.

Navy Now Accepting Three Year Enlistments

The Navy will accept volunteers for the first year term enlistment and will permit certain young men to reenlist for two or three years in an experimental program. Vice Admiral William R. Smedberg, III, Chief of Naval Personnel announced today.

The experimental program has been placed in operation, Admiral Smedberg said, to meet the increased readiness posture of the Navy and the Nation. It will remain in effect until June 30th, 1962. The three year enlistment program is open to men who have had no prior military training. Under the reenlistment program, eligible personnel who have been released from active duty may reenlist with an option of up to 30 days advance leave. Formerly, broken service men reenlisted for four or six years with no

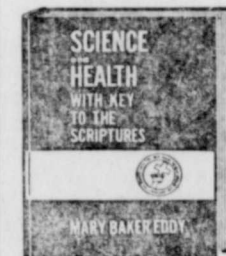

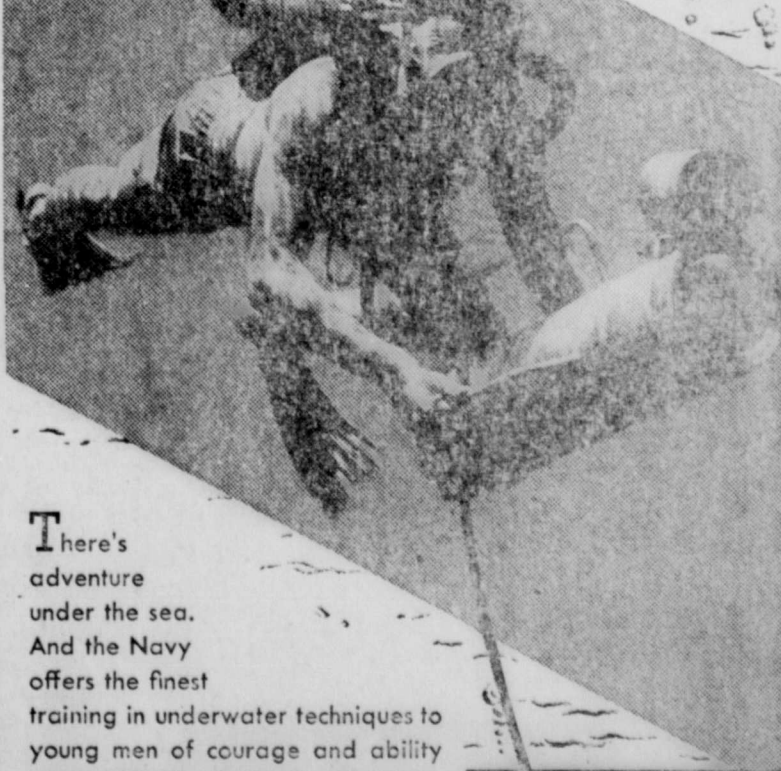
