All ranchers in Sterling County are invited to tour the Foster Conger ranch next Tuesday, October 1. The tour is sponsored by the North Concho River Soil Conservation District. Meeting place for the group will be the courthouse in Sterling City at 9 a.m.

After the tour, the district is sponsoring a barbecue at 11:30 a.m. in the City Park in Sterling City. A new supervisor for Zone 5 of the district will be elected at that time. Present supervisor for zone is Foster Conger.

Zone 5 is the south part of Sterling County, or all of the county south of the North Concho River. All ranchers are invited to the barbecue and tour regardless of the area in which they live.

This is an excellent opportunity for all to see the Conger ranch and what has been done in the way of conservation. Don't forget—the tour will leave the courthouse at nine a. m. Tuesday and the barbecue will be held at 11:30 in the City Park.

Its nearly time for the big State Fair of Texas again! Opening date of the Fair is October 5 and closing date is October 20.

As usual, the first portion of the Fair is the Pan-American Livestock Exposition. During this portion of the Fair, all breeding livestock will be in place; this portion of the Fair will end on October 13th and the Junior Livestock show will take over for the final week.

A number of entries have been made in the Pan-American Exposition from Sterling County. Betty Jo Barrett and Janis Igo will show in the Junior Rambouillet sheep show which is a portion of the Pan-American. Others entered include William and J.Q. Foster in the Suffolk sheep show and Clinton and L.F. Hodges in the Rambouillet show.

The Junior Rambouillet show will be judged on Saturday afternoon, October 5. The adult Rambouillets will be judged on Monday after-

noon, October 7; Suffolks will be judged on Tuesday afternoon.

The National Register of Merit Hereford show will be judged on Tuesday, October 8. According to Don Clark, assistant manager of the livestock department, over 350 entries have been received in the Hereford show.

During the week of September 8-14, forty-nine cases of screwworms were identified in Texas; during the same week last year, there were 823 cases in the state. New Mexico had ninety-one cases this year compared with 34 last year.

Hottest spot in the state during the period named was Jeff Davis County with nineteen cases followed by Brewster County with nine.

Sterling County had no cases identified as screwworms since August 27. There were several other than screwworm.

The next few weeks are the crucial times in the program. If there is rain during the cooler season before frost, there is a possibility of a number of cases showing up. Ranchers are urged to continue to watch their livestock for all possible signs of screw worms. If you find worms, send them in for identification and treat the case promptly. Flies are still available for the hot-spot treatment method which has been practiced all summer for this part of the state. Screwworm cases which go untreated now could well mean trouble for the program next year. If the worms are allowed to mature and drop from the wound to enter the ground for the hibernation period, and it was to turn cold, these pupa would remain in the ground and emerge as screwworm flies next spring.

Thus far, support and cooperation has been splendid in this area. Continued support and cooperation from now through the early winter months will make the job that much easier next year.

Fire Department Tested Sunday

A staff writer for the San Angelo Standard-Times was in Sterling City last Sunday seeking information on why the fire insurance rate was so high in the city and county. He said according to figures released by the Insurance Commission in Austin the rate was the second highest in this 18 county area of West Texas.

He had a run down on the fire siren testing, the volunteer set-up, and the condition of the fire trucks here.

He said for the past five years Sterling people had paid a total of \$63,174.00 in fire insurance premiums, and had shown a fire loss of only \$7,075.00. And for the year 1962, Sterling people had paid \$8,764.00 in fire premiums and that the loss had been \$1,011, according to the records.

Fire chief Jim Cantrell had the siren blown and two persons called in to know where the fire was in 30 seconds and seven in the first minute, and would have been taking off for action had they been needed.

Cantrell said the writer said that many cities of the area had less equipment, etc. than Sterling but had a lower key rate. The chief said he planned to go to Austin before long and see if we could get credit on our equipment for a lower key rate. The rate here is 85c per hundred valuation.

Cantrell said the fire trucks were in perfect shape and a number of conditions had been met through the years but no cuts in the key rate had been effected.

Barbecue Set for October 12

Chief Cantrell said that he was planning to hold a barbecue in the park on October 12 for the volunteers that always helped in fires and other in the county.

How To Grow A Mold Garden

1. Expose a slice of bread to the air for an hour. Mold spores will fall upon it. Sprinkle the bread lightly with water and place in a covered glass jar. Put the jar in a warm, dark cupboard for a week. Bread mold has white stalks with little black balls on the ends. These are the spore cases.
2. Water mold can be made by placing several dead flies in a jar of water. In a few days the insects are covered with a white fuzz.
3. An orange, apple, or other fruit which has been bruised



can be bottled. The mold and bacteria working on the fruit gradually caused it to disintegrate and rot. Penicillium molds are one type growing on fruits.

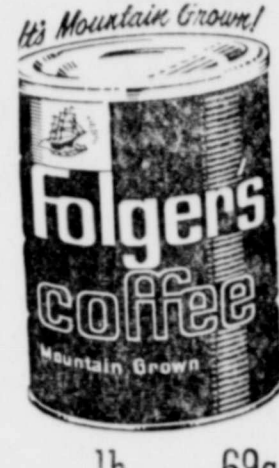

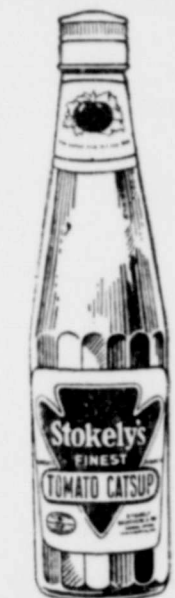

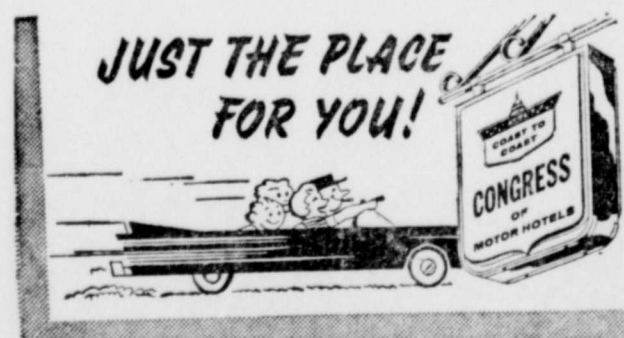

For Social Security

A new concept in social security was described today as "partial retirement payments" by Floyd B. Ellington, Social Security Administration district manager at San Angelo. Mr. Ellington stated that a large number of persons in the district are getting some retirement benefits even though they are working and earning more than \$1200 per year. He also estimated that 600 more persons in the district could be receiving from one to eleven months' benefits per year by filing an application. Ellington went on to explain that earnings of \$1200 per year is no longer an absolute level beyond which all social security benefits are cut off. Instead, \$1200 is the point at which all social security benefits begin to be adjusted due to excess earnings. "The actual point of earnings at which all benefits are cut off varies with the total yearly benefits due the family," Ellington said. He urged that all workers past retirement age check with the social security office at San Angelo for an individual analysis of their status. "Don't delay - check today," Ellington emphasized. Benefits are retroactive for only 12 months before the month of filing an application, and applications filed now will allow us to consider paying back benefits for a whole year.

Many people are not aware they don't have to retire completely to receive social security benefits according to Floyd B. Ellington, social security district manager. Ellington stated that special provisions in the social security law make it possible to receive some social security benefits even though a person may have fairly high earnings. He explained that a person can earn \$1200 during the year and receive all of his benefits. And just \$1 in benefits is withheld for every \$2 earned between \$1200 and \$1700. For earnings over \$1700, \$1 in benefits is withheld for each \$1 earned. Ellington pointed out that a

full month's benefits is payable for any month in which the beneficiary does not earn over \$100 in wages and does not actively engage in self-employment.

Ellington urged all workers to visit the social security office when they near retirement age to learn more about their benefit rights. The office is located at 204 Continental Bldg., San Angelo, Texas.

Has disability robbed you of your earnings capacity? If so, you should check with your social security office, according to Floyd B. Ellington, district manager in San Angelo. Monthly benefits can be

paid at any age to working people who have become unable to work by reason of a severe disability that is expected to last for a long time. Benefits begin with the seventh month of disability, but an application may be made before that time. To be eligible, the disabled worker must have social security for at least 5 years' work in the ten year period before he became disabled.

When you make your application the social security office will assist you in securing the medical evidence necessary. When this evidence has been obtained, along with other facts, a decision will be made as to whether your condition is severe enough to qualify you as "disabled" under the terms of the law.

If you think you meet the requirements or know of anyone who may be eligible, get in touch with the social security office in San Angelo as soon as possible. Delay may result in a loss of benefits.

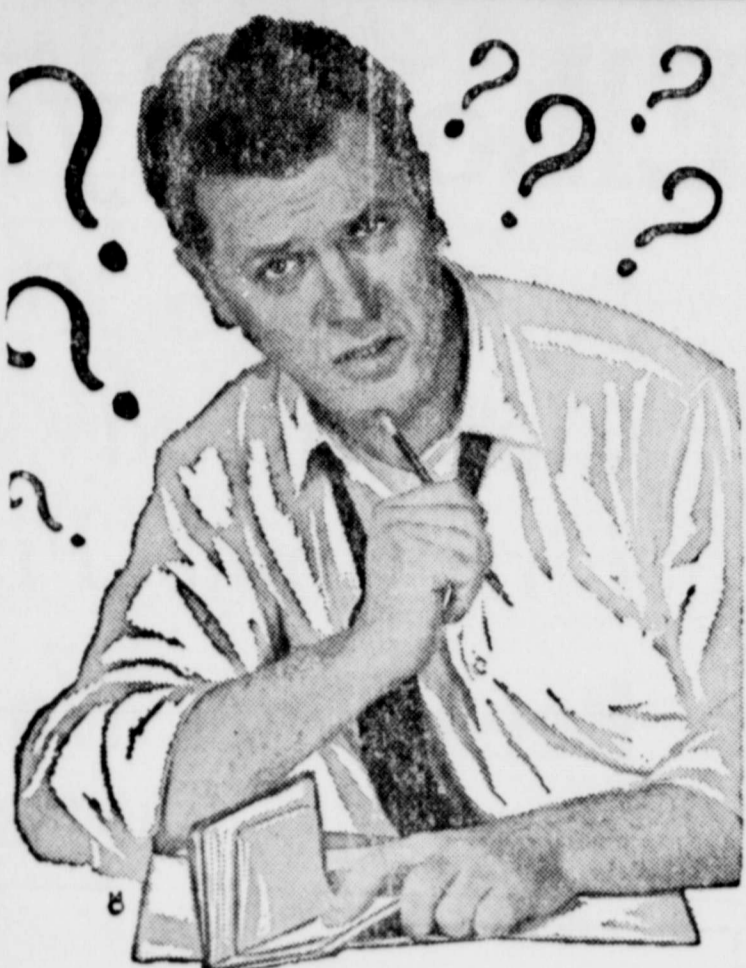

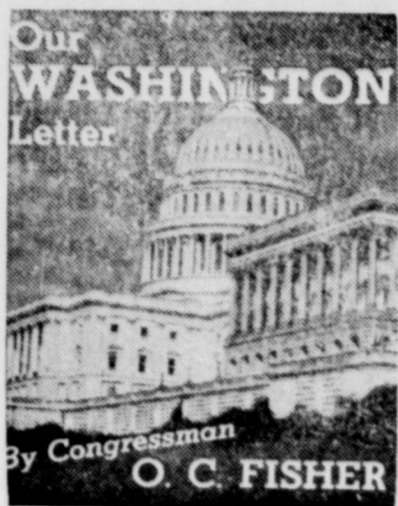

After months of hearings the House Ways and Means Committee has finally come out with a new tax bill. It would trim \$10 billion from the annual cost of tax payments. By a one-vote margin the committee declined to tie any cut to a requirement that spending budgets be reduced.

While tax reduction is over due, the Congress is faced with a dilemma: can a \$10 billion cut be justified at a time when the annual deficit is estimated at \$10 billion—thus making a \$20 billion net deficit the first year?

While it is true that a reduction in taxes can be expected to stimulate some increase in revenue by encouraging business activity, it will take a year or two for this to become noticeable.

In the meantime, prospects for a retrenchment of federal spending is very uncertain. With a dozen new spending programs, all admittedly non-essential, now pending in the Congress, no move has been made to terogo these new ventures in spending in order to justify a tax cut. If that were done several billion dollars could be saved, and the tax cut would make more sense.

In short, it is we are to have fiscal responsibility in the operation of the government it seems imperative that any tax cut should be tied with a clearly defined program of reduced spending. Otherwise an increased deficit will lead inevitably to more inflation—a dollar that is not worth as much and will not buy as much.

Cloak rooms have been buzzing recently with talk about Harry Truman. While he was President, Truman was an advocate of civil rights legislation, then considered rather radical. But recently he has frowned on sit-ins, freedom rides, demonstrations, and some of the more radical legislation now being proposed. And, incidently, he has spoken out against a tax cut without retrenchment in spending. In a Cleveland speech the other night the former President was blunt and outspoken. "The argument on civil rights has been stirred up by Boston and New England demagogues just as the War between the States was brought about by Harriet Beecher Stowe and William Lloyd Garrison . . ."

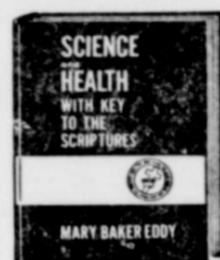

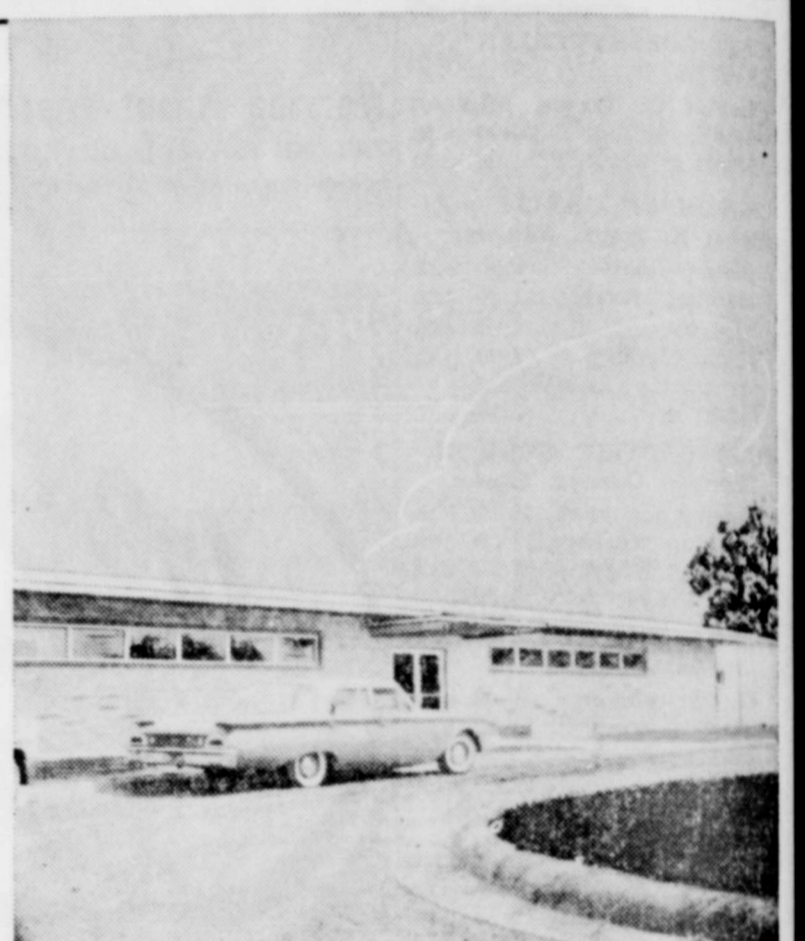
