When two or more defendants are involved in a single crime, the total reward is limited to \$500.00, but the conviction of one defendant, even though the other defendants are acquitted. will entitle the claimant or claimants to said sum of \$500.00. All claims must be submitted within ninety (90) days following conviction. If, upon conviction, a defendant confesses other thefts, no additional reward will be paid. In saucepan, soften gelatine in cold water. Place over low heat, stirring until gelatine is dissolved. Remove from heat; stir in soup, vinegar, salt, and "Tabasco". Chill until slightly thickened. Fold in cucumber, green pepper, and onion. Pour into a 3-cup mold. Chill until firm. Unmold; serve on salad greens. If de-sired, garnish with thin cucumber slices.


