



**Social Security Tips**

Floyd B. Ellington, district manager of social security in San Angelo, issued a reminder today to all persons who are receiving social security benefits that they must notify the Social Security Administration whenever something happens that might affect the payment of their benefits. Some of the events which must be reported are:

1. Earnings from all types of work if the beneficiary is under age 72 and expects to earn more than \$1200 during the year.
2. Death of a beneficiary.
3. Change in marital status—unless the beneficiary is receiving payments as a retired worker.
4. Change of custody of a child or other person for whom you are receiving benefits.
5. Change in address.

"Social security beneficiaries received a list of these and other events that must be reported with this check earlier this year," Ellington said. "If they do not have this list, they may pick up another at the social security office."

"In fact, anyone who has a question about social security should get in touch with us to get correct information."

Will your social security monthly retirement check be \$100 or \$120? If your wife claims her payments when she's 62, will they increase when she reaches 65? These are some of the questions you might like to have answered before you retire. Floyd B. Ellington, District Manager of the office in San Angelo said it's a good idea to visit their office about three months before that date. There is an advantage of your applying well ahead of time. Most applications go through without any trouble, but every once in a while someone has trouble proving his age or providing some other form of needed evidence. When that happens everything grinds to a stop until a satisfactory age or birth record or other proof is supplied. If you wait until you retire to make your claim, and you don't have the records you need, your first check may be delayed. If you don't need your social security right away, it won't matter, but most folks count on that first check as part of their post-retirement budget.

When you visit the social security office three months before retirement, there are some records you'll need to take. The best way to find out what you should take is to phone ahead. In addition to

a record of your age, you may need to taken your last withholding tax statement. If your wife is 62 and wants to apply for benefits also, she'll need a record of her age. If you call the social security office before you pay the pre-retirement visit, they can tell you exactly what you'll need. If there's some record you don't have, they can usually help you get it. Helping people with retirement claims is their business. For example, they know the best, and quickest way to get a record of your age.

Some people delay a trip to the social security office because they think a social security claim will be a lot of trouble. It isn't an automatic thing, but highly trained people will do everything to help you. There are three things to remember. First, plan ahead for your retirement. Second, call the social security office. Find out what to take with you, and the best time to go. Third don't wait until after you retire to make your social security claim. **LESSONS IN CAPITALISM**

Recently a prominent economist rose up to say that too many Americans knew very little about our capitalistic form of free enterprise. His observation was right on target. In a country whose bounty depends on capitalism, many people simply are not aware of how the system works.

One of the main reasons for this knowledge gap is the fact that school systems generally provide only a once-over-lightly view of economics. The situation appears to be improving some, but we still have a long way to go.

In the view of the New York Stock Exchange, a highly effective way of teaching young Americans the ABC's of free enterprise is to give them a share or two of stock for themselves. As shareowners, teen-aged capitalists can receive annual reports and financial statements, follow the price of their stock in the newspaper market tables and even receive regular dividend checks.

Parents can make stock gifts to children now without red tape thanks to special legislation enacted in all 50 states in the past ten years. An adult merely has the security registered in the name of the child's custodian, usually one of the parents. Any security can be given, and there is no limit on the amount.

Stock gifts for minors is a good idea. Certainly a teen-ager who happens to be a shareowner himself will be inclined to learn the ABC's of our capitalistic economy—if only to find out why his stock isn't going up as fast as he wished it would.

AROUND THE COUNTY

Sterling County 4-H Club members scored very well last week in the lamb show at the State Fair in Dallas. Eleven lambs were taken to the show and nine of these placed in their classes. Placings were given in last week's issue of the News-Record.

This was the largest lamb show held in Dallas. Over seven hundred lambs were on hand for the show which is about three hundred above the usual number.

Club members who showed lambs were Charlotte, Rosanne and Skeete Foster, Janis and Lee Wayne Igo, Randy Sally and Susan Mixon, and Nola Stewart. A number of the club members' parents were on hand to get the lambs ready for the show and to boost them on show day. Those present were Mr. and Mrs. Ross Foster, Mr. and Mrs. Ray Mixon and Fred Igo.

About seventy-five men turned out for the annual meeting and barbecue of the Sterling County Game Management Association Friday evening. The affair had been postponed twice because of rain—a pretty good reason for postponement here.

John I. Moore of San Angelo brought the program. He had an interesting group of slides of some of his hunting trips to Africa and a good commentary to go along with them. However, he did not get to finish his story or show all his slides as the bulb on his projector burned out before he could finish. Later, Mr. Moore commented that he usually had a spare bulb along and nothing happened. This time he had no spare so he had trouble.

Officers elected for the coming year are Stan Horwood, president; John Copeland, vice-president; and Marvin Foster, secretary-treasurer. Two directors will be appointed by this group to serve as members of the executive committee.

It's about time for your pecans to begin falling. Many have already fallen and the others will continue to do so until after the first freeze when the last will shed off.

It's a good idea to keep the old hulls or shucks picked up around the trees. These shucks often harbor many of the eggs of the insects that will give trouble next year. If they are kept cleaned up and burned, you may be avoiding some trouble for next year.

Livestock producers are reminded that they can get their cows tested for brucellosis if they back tag those they are shipping to market. An agreement has been made with

inspectors at all federal and state inspected plants to have them draw blood of all back-tagged cows. In the past, this agreement was not in effect and the backtag program was not as effective. If a producer has fifteen percent of his cows tested in this manner in a three year period, he will not have to be tested when the county comes up for recertification under the brucellosis plan.

Backtags and glue along with the card to be sent in are available in all county agent's offices. During the last recertification in Sterling County, those who had done this did not have to gather their cattle for another blood test. The present certification expires in March, 1967.

All county agents and home demonstration agents are in College Station this week for the State Extension Conference. The conference is held every two years for all extension members.

Last year the Methodist youth here raised \$78.46 for the United Nations Childrens Fund. This year, again, the youth will raise money for this cause on Sunday, with a Trick or Treat program for UNICEF. The Methodist pastor, the Rev. Leo Ross, asks that the community again do a good job of giving toward alleviating the suffering and hungering children all over the world. It is surprising just what even a quarter can do in the way of medical aid.

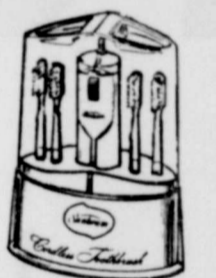

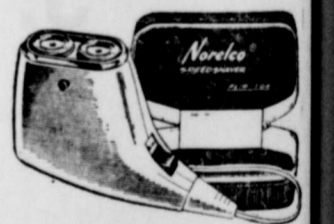
