



# JOB AND BUSINESS OPPORTUNITY AT STAKE



The "fence" must be torn down if Texas is to get its just share of new and needed industrial growth and expansion. Texas must have industrial growth if our economy is to expand and provide more job opportunity. Farming, mining, and manufacturing are the three main foundation piers that support our basic economy. Farming and mining as sources of employment are growing weaker. Manufacturing (or processing) must be strengthened to bear more and more weight or the economy will topple. Special lures to industry, though temporarily appealing, are not the answer. A good business climate, as reflected through governmental intent, will provide the appeal that will secure the stable industries essential to the long-range growth of the economy. House Bill 54, now pending in the Legislature, would, if enacted, remove a major defect in the Texas business climate by amending and up-dating the antiquated Texas Workmen's Compensation laws. House Bill 54 is being opposed by a "vocal few" who, either because of selfishness or lack of understanding, want the law to remain in its present inadequate, antiquated form. Will these few be permitted to impede the progress of the economy and the resultant benefit to the many? This is the question the Legislature must answer. Job and business opportunity is at stake.







Since the hardened steel cannot stretch, it cracks. Iron powder electrodes which supply an atmosphere low in hydrogen are used to prevent faulty welds.
