The next few weeks will be good time to spray your pecan trees, and fruit trees also, for the control of scale. Scale is a tiny insect which sucks the sap from branches and leaves, causing them to lose their leaves and die back from the tip.

The scale covers the fullgrown female. A scale is usually about an eighth of an inch long and dark gray in color, resembling the bark of the tree. Infested limbs appear to have had wood ashes sprinkled on them. The female spends the winter under the covering on the bark, never moving from the spot she has selected. Herman Everitt was known for his dry sense of humor. He also related how, at his daughter's request, he wore his cowboy boots to her formal wedding. "When I gave her away," he said, "I got my boot tangled up in her train—and I kicked like a bay steer!"

He once told of spending piano-lesson money on more exciting things, and of how, at college graduation, he was to play a classical piece. "Right in the middle of it, my mind went blank, and I broke out into 'Casey Jones.' That brought the house down."

Ranching always came first, but Mr. Everitt often took time to entertain friends with his old-time piano playing, or with a "fiddle" tune. He told how, when in college, he was asked to play for dances. "Being a preacher's son." he said, "I just couldn't get caught playing for a dance!" Then—the shades were drawn while "Preach Everitt" proceeded to play for the festivities.

On January 24, 1968, the day of his death from a heart attack, Herman Everitt carried on his ranching business as usual, finally taking time in the late afternoon to go to the hospital. There, after only a brief examination, Mr. Everitt died as he had wished to go- Blackwell. "with his boots on."
