## Social Security Tips

A record \$11,000 in monthly social security benefits was ural gas users meters in Ster- being paid to residents of ling City except every other Sterling County at the end of month for the hot summer December, 1968, according to Ted F. Moellering district manager for social security.

"Throughout the country, monthly benefits payable at the end of 1968 amounted to nearly \$2.1 billion, some \$350 million higher than at the end of 1967," Mr. Moellering continued. "Approximately threequarters of the increased monthly amount resulted from higher benefit rates authorized by the 1967 Amendments to the Social Security Act. The remainder of the increase was simply due to a greater number of beneficiaries."

Be the end of May, 1969, social security will be paying monthly benefits to more than 2 million people - 1 out of every 8 Americans. Although retired workers comprise the largest group of beneficiaries, almost one-fourth of all people receiving benefits are under 60. There are currently more than 3.8 million children and .5 million young widowed mothers receiving payments. program for old people.


