You are urged to be particularly careful in regard to the above precautions in the use of any insecticides. Within the last few days, one insecticide familiar to many, DDT. was banned and ordered removed from the market in the future. While DDT is not widely used now, this may be the first of many more such restrictions to come. DDT has largely been replaced by Sevin, a safer insecticide but we may see some removed that cannot be replaced as easily. Misuse and the resultant bad publicity brought about this restriction and can bring on more. Always read and follow the directions!




