Many of the insecticides may not be dangerous in the quantity used but if used over a longer period of time, they accumulate in the body and are not dissipated. Eventually, the amount in the body builds up to the level of danger. This is what the regulatory agen-cies are concerned with in their regulations.





learning a foreign language. Candidates who pass the written test are called for oral interviews in the order of their standing on the list. The oral interview is designed to determine if the candidate has the personal qualities needed for the work. Applicants must also pass a rigid physical examination. Candidates who are selected for appointment are assigned to the Border Patrol Academy for a period of intensive training in such subjects as immigration laws, Spanish, physical training and marksmanship. Trainees receive full pay while in the academy.

Applications are now being accepted for the civil service examination for Immigration Patrol Inspector which will be held on Saturday, January 24, 1970. 


