# The illegal trial of Jesus... Part Two

In what I thought then, and still think, was one of the best introductions to a speech that I ever heard was one given by Gen. Douglas McArthur as he addressed a joint session of the Congress of the United States.



# New regulations go into effect for breeding bulls entering state

Beginning April 1, issue. breeding bulls entering state must be either 24 months of age or younger and certified as a virgin, or be tested negative for cattle trichomoniasis entry.

The entry requirements are part of a regulatory package adopted by the commissioners for the Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) Feb. 24 to address trichomoniasis, a venereal disease of cattle that causes infertility and in extended breeding seasons and diminished valuable income.

The high school has implemented a student mentoring program using faculty and staff as the mentors. It is called, "Family Matters."


Each high school staff member has 9-10 students that are part of their "family."
