Reddy's Helpful Tips

- ★ Return fresh foods to the refrigerator and frozen foods, such as ice cream, to the freezer as soon as possible. Measure and remove the quantity needed for cooking or for the table, and refrigerate the remainder at once.
- ★ Use cold controls efficiently by selecting the settings that provide about 36° F. in the refrigerator and 0° F. in the freezer.
- ★ Fill the refrigerator with food, but be careful not to overfill. Make sure that food packages don't block air vents in the freezer or refrigerator section.
- ★ Clean the condenser surfaces of the refrigerator; dirt restricts air flow and acts to insulate the condenser, forcing the refrigerator to work harder and longer to maintain proper temperatures.

We are building a new home and are going to rent our present house. We plan to leave the stove and refrigerator in the 'rent' house to better our chances of renting. How can we insure these appliances?

The rent property itself, should be covered by a standard Fire Policy—specifically insuring the building. The definition of a building or dwelling in the standard Fire Policy includes building equipment. Since you deem it necessary for renting the property to equip the house with stove and refrigerator, the appliances would be considered building equipment. As building equipment, your appliances would be covered under the standard Fire Policy. In some of the newer forms of coverage such as Special Multi Peril Form MLB-100, these appliances are specifically mentioned under the building definition.

LEGAL NOTICE ORDER RE: LAND VALUES FOR TAXATION

The Commissioners' Court of Sterling County, Texas, in special session on this 15th day of March A.D. 1976, in order to achieve a more equitable tax valuation base and remove the great variation in existing valuations for the agricultural lands of Sterling County, it was moved by Commissioner C.W. Smith and seconded by Commissioner Billy R. Bynum, and unanimously adopted by the Court that, effective for the tax year 1976, no agricultural acreage land shall be assessed at a value less than \$7.50 per acre, and that all other agricultural acreage lands having an assessed value of \$7.50 per acre or more, shall remain at their present assessed value.

Social Security News

Social security checks should be cashed within a reasonable time to prevent loss or theft, even though there's no time limit on cashing them, according to social security officials here.

'If your check is lost or stolen, get in touch with your nearest social security office at once,' a spokesman said. 'The check can be replaced, but it takes time. Handle your check carefully when you get it and you won't have to wait while it's being replaced.'

Social security pays over \$4 billion a month in benefit checks to almost 29 million people—eligible retired and disabled workers and their families and families of deceased workers who worked long enough under social security.

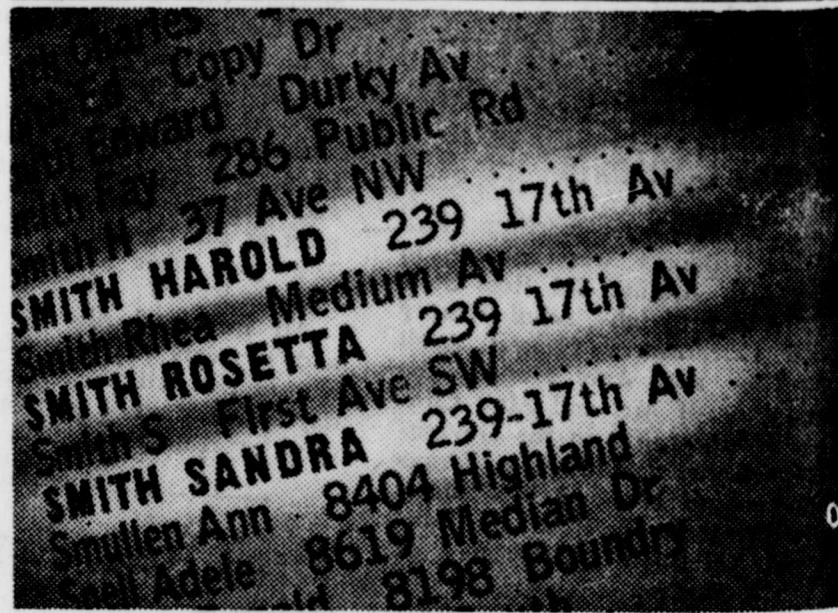

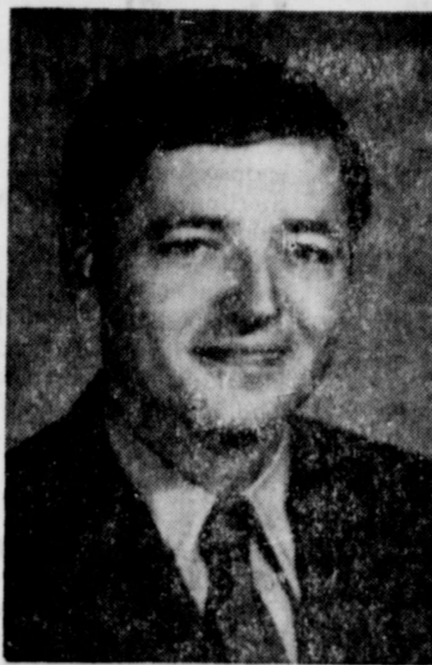
