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THE PROSPECT BRIGHTENS.
The Washington dispatch reporting the consolidation of Mexican affairs by the cabinet, published in yesterday's Express, with some of the reasons in the hands of every law Western Texas citizen. The news seems almost too good to be true, but we will all at least hope that it is. It has taken a long time to secure the situation of the administration to the assembly of decisive action regarding the Mexican frontier, and our long suffering people had begun to despair. Now, however, the prospects are brightening.

In all diplomatic relations, it cannot be denied that our government has conducted every measure to secure peace and the protection of the rights and property of American citizens on our frontier. The forbearance, self-restraint and patience of the profession of the Mexican government for a better condition of things, have been perfectly wonderful in the face of the facts and the repeated failure to make good the promise. But it seems the government at Washington has at length awakened to the fact that the Mexican government either cannot or will not furnish the citizens for raising into our hands, and therefore we are promised that the government will not be independent of that of our neighbors and take the whole matter of frontier protection in its own hands.

If our government adopt and adhere strictly to the policy announced in the dispatch, an era of the greatest prosperity will soon dawn upon Western Texas, if the Mexicans will so conduct themselves as to ensure peace. There is no necessity for war or any kind of trouble between the two governments. Let the Mexicans conduct themselves properly and there will be no aggression from this side. If raiding parties, coming to possess or property, come into our territory, in following them to their hiding places, no good Mexican citizen will be so complacent as to allow them to pass. Our troops will simply be doing a duty the Mexican government either will not or cannot perform. The regular and efficient of our troops will be sufficient to give all citizens in unadventured there will be no safe retreat for them in the future, would put a stop to the raiding business, and with a guaranteed protection the magnificent country of Western Texas would soon be filled with an industrious and prosperous class of people. That, and not war with Mexico, is what Western Texas want, and all will join in the hope that trouble will be averted. If, however, the Mexican government insist on maintaining the policy of things that has heretofore existed, let the United States make Mexico feel the full strength of her arm, and the people of Western Texas will not shrink from the danger and horrors of the action, for those who survive the ordeal would be assured of the peace and protection they have so long been strangers to. When the Mexicans are satisfied of our determination and feel our power, then they will respect us.

But let not the position of the people of Western Texas be misinterpreted in this connection. We do not desire all things to go as we wish.
