

Notwithstanding the explicit and frequent assertions of the total absence of yellow fever in this city, it appears that you are still laboring under a false impression of its existence in our midet. To obviate, if possible, such an erromous belief, I desire to state again most emphatically, and once for all, any statement to the contrary notwithstanding, that St. Louis has never had, nor has ahe now, a single local case of yellow fever. The humanity and hospitality of our people to refuse shelter and treatment to that large number of upfortunates who have been drism from their homes in the South, and perhaps with the govers of the disease in their reception and treatment this city has astablished a quaranting station twenty miles below the city, and we exact from all persons a strict compliance with our sanitary regulations.
