I can positively assure the people that hereafter no mails will be allowed to enter Arkansas and Texas from points infected so long as the legally constituted boards of health refuse to receive them. While the Postoffice Department wishes to co-operate in every way possible with local authorities to prevent the spread of yellow fever, an indiscriminate cutting off of mail communication is a very serious matter, its damaging effects to the business and social interests of a community being incalculable. It is therefore to be hoped that your health officials and those having the consideration of these matters may not find it necessary to prohibit the receipt or passage of the mails from St. Louis or the North.
