Snow-White Cotton Fields.

Along the line of our railroad the tourists often for miles constantly in sight of cotton fields. Cotton, indeed, is King in Western Texas this year, for the yield will prove wonderfully great. The early season tended to early mature the plant, which has fully satisfied the husbandman with the richest kind of a yield. The stalks are now hung, from the lower to the topermost branches, with the snow-white fibre, and the fields appear, as they rise and decline over the hill and dale, almost as if they were covered with snow. However distant, the cotton field is indicated by the white coat that clads it. There is a great lack of assistance to gather the crop, and it is feared that early fall rains will set in and ruin much of the staple. The estimate of the yield in four counties alone, Guadalupa, Caldwell, Gonzales and Wilson, fixes the number of bales at 50,000. Though cotton is lower than it was ever known, some farmers are even offering one-half to pickers. Editors San Astonic Expanse:

It will be inferred from the recent publication of a circular signed by the Governor, Comptroller, and Secretary of the State Bossel of Education, stating the fact that only a very small amount of funds remain in the treasury to support the schools consequent upon the failure of the Legislature to make the necessary appropriation for the fiscal year, that the schools must remain in closed until the appropriation shall have been made.

That the members of the last Legislature have been guilty of a gross neglect of duty now operates successfully in closing the doors of the public schools upon the children of their constituency to-day when they should be enjoying the privilege of receiving an education to pay for which their parents are taxed, there can be no question of doubt raised, and they deserve, and are receiving the censure and rebuke of their people by being refused re-election to the seats which they failed to fill satisfactorily, but this does not mend matters for the present, although it will have a satisfactory effect in the future and at the next session of the Legislature.

The only solution of the perplexing problem which has been proposed up to the present is one offered by a teacher, which appears practicable, feasible, and advantageous and should be adopted, although it does not render the schools when opened, under the method which he suggests, entirely a State institution, but because it will secure an uninterrupted assion of the schools from the time of its adoption until ry a state institution, but because it win secure an uninterrupted assion of the schools from the time of its adoption until the necessary appropriation shall have been made and enables their continuation from that time to the end of the allotted period for which the appropriation has been made.

In his communication to one of the trus-

for which the appropriation has been made. In his communication to one of the trustees he says:

"The best solution of the school problem would be reached by the trustees of each precinct calling a meeting of the parents and heads of families therein, at which a fund which, together with the amount that is now in the State Treasury, will suffice to support the schools until the legislature shall have made the necessary appr-priations, can be contributed in every county and precinct in the State. This plan is simple and secures the opening of the schools and the services of efficient teachers, and while it requires the pecuniary aid and assistance of parents who are willing to cooperate in the movement, in addition to the amount of the fund appropriated from the tax, still as the appropriation is always meagre and only suffices to secure a session in the schools of four months at the utmost, in consequence of which fact it has been customary with parents to contribute to the support and continue the schools in operation after the expiration of the State school session, it only amounts to a change in the period when this voluntary contribution is given and does not effect any difference in the length of time for which it is extended; in other words, you open the schools and the State continues them after a definite period
