

lars a day would be ample for all expenses when traveling at good speed. Usually one goes at such a rate as to reduce the expenses to three dollars a day.

One gets considerable insight into Norwegian manners and customs on such a journey. The loneliness of the country is manifest in the fact that it is the arrest thing to meet any person or vehicle on the road. The poverty is seen not in the squalor and beggary of the people—for I have not met a beggar in Norway—but in the planeness and smallness of the houses, built usually of logs, and often roofed over with birch bark covered with turf, on which the grass grows long, and the daisies bloom plentifully. Occasionally a goat is seen perched on the roof, to eat down the luxurient vegetation. The women and men alike work in the fields and row in the boats. One woman I saw mowing grass with a sickle, who had her child strapped to her back with a cord passed under its arms and around its knees, and tied to the shoulders and waist of its mother. But one sees almost no signs of wretchedness and discontent. The country folk are a sober, almost sombre people, but kindly well traveled.
