It is the general opinion among lawyers familiar with the subject that the Arlington ejectment suit, which the United States.dis-trict court has just decided in favor of Gen. Lee, will be decided by the United States surice court has just decided in favor of Gen.
Lee, will be decided by the United States supreme court, to which it has been appealed, in his favor. The judgment of the lower court restores the entire estate to him, and calls for the ejectment of all tenants who have been in possession since the sale of it under tax law in 1863.
