Berlin, February 12.—The German Reichstag to day was opened by the Emperor Wilhelm. In his speech from the throne he said he thanked the members for assisting in the suppression of the socialistic agitation, and hoped they would continue to support the government as far as necessary for the ourse of socialistic evils. He associated the provention of articles 3, of the treaty of Frague, and referred with pleasure to the friendly relations with Austria, and the results of the Berlin congross. He declared that the relations between Germany and all other powers are satisfactory and that the would continue to use her infraoure in behalf of peace.
