The total sum recommended by this bill is \$2,379,040.57. There are but two appropriation bills to be passed by the house, namely, the legislative executive and judicial, which will in all probability be ready to report by the time the legislative bill is disposed of.

FEDERAL OFFICIALS INDICTED AT NEW ORLEANS.

NEW ORLEANS.

New Orleans, February 17,—Judge Billings, in the United States circuit court, said a statement of the facts had been presented to Judge Woods by the grand jury, which facts had been presented to the grand jurors in the jury room, and upon which the grand jury had returned true bills of indictment. These are true bills upon which it is said the district attorney declined to frame indictments. More than one federal official is included in the list. 
