Waco Telephone: Grain men, merehants and farmers alike, manifest more than usual interest as to whether or not Galveston will be prepared to handle the wheat crop of central and northern Texas this year. The acreage in wheat, in all the tier of counties surrounding Waco, Dallas and Fort Worth, is larger than ever before, and at this time, despite the long continued dry weather, the crop prospect is eminently promising. With no backest the yield is going to be immense, and the question of a sea-board market, with facilities to handle grain, becomes a matter of no small importance. It is a well known fact that our Texas wheat is admirably adap-

ted for shipping across seas, and with a fine rea-board just south of us, and ample sail facilities to carry grain to tide water, it is a matter of regret that Galveston, the chief city and commercial metropolis of the State, should be utterly inadequate to the task of handling home products. Last year Texas bad to send large quantities of her grain to New York and New Orleans. Galveston could not handle it. If the unfinished gap in the New Orleans and Texas railroad were closed up, New Orleans would this year receive seven out of every ten bushels of grain raised in Texas.
