The state of Texas, in its wisdom or unwisdom, has passed a law levying a tax of \$200 a year on drummers, and a convention is to be held in the opera-house at Dallas next Wednesday to secure a repeal of the law. The Post-Dispatch now has so wide a circulation in Texas that it cannot afford to remain indifferent to anything which interests that great state, and we cannot help wishing that the convention may be well attended, may be wisely managed, and may achieve the accomplishment of its object.
