### SOOVILLE'S ARGUMENTS.

### In Behalf of the Assassin—Insanity the Only Plea—History of the Guiteau Family.

WASHINGTON, November 22.—Guiteau was brought to the courthouse about nine o'clock. The van was guarded by police in the rear. His personal appearance has undergone a great change since the first days of the trial. His hair is thinning, and his eyes have disappeared, as also his habit of looking up and casting court glances about him. He is now a thin, pale man, with a look of despair on his face. He looked about the room and bowed politely to some one at a distance from him.

At ten minutes after ten Sooville resumed his argument. He attacked the plea of insanity, and discussed at great length the growth and changes in the opinion upon the subject of insanity and its treatment by the courts when set up by the defense in criminal cases. He cited numerous cases and rulings in several states where insanity was pleaded, and claimed that the plea of insanity having been set up by the prosecution.

Mr. Sooville continued his argument until noon. He was permitted to enter the courtroom by Guiteau, who interjected observations characteristic of the man, and which did not add to the weight of the argument his counsel was making.
