Mr. E. D. Baxza has been relieved from duty at St. Louis to take position as chief quartermaster department of Columbia, Mo. He was previously in the department of Texas, as recently reported, to be succeeded here by Maj. Lee, from the department of the East. Capt. John Stuppert, of this department, goes to Denver as quartermaster.

This people of San Antonio are beginning to inquire why we do not have the free postal delivery system established here. They point out the qualifications, the facts have been presented to the department at Washington, and everything has been ripe for months.
