WASHINGTON.

Senator Logan reported favorably from the military committee, and asked the immediate consideration of the House joint resolution appropriating \$10,000,000 to supply the deficiency in appropriations for army pensions for the current fiscal year.

He explained that the deficit had arisen in consequence of the increased clerical force having facilitated the work of the department beyond the amount estimated for in the original \$50,000,000 estimate for the year past.

Under order for the calendar, the senate took up the senate bill for the relief of the officers and crew of the U. S. steamer Monitor, who participated in an action with the German cruiser Mercur in March, 1902.

The amount of the appropriation is stated at the actual value of the Mercur at the date of the action, not exceeding \$300,000. Passed, Yeas, 24; nays, 23.
